

PASTOR'S NOTE SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME | JANUARY 15, 2023

Phase II up-date: Exciting things are happening! We are moving forward with our building addition. After many listening sessions last year, and this past spring, the parish has spoken. The plan is to do the following: add on a gathering space and offices on the west side of the church, repurpose the current office spaces for additional classrooms, and repurpose the north classrooms for a Catholic pre-school (to be run by an outside party). There will also be some changes in the parking spaces, and most likely a playground will be in the next phase.

We are working with RDG architects out of Omaha to plan the design. This is the same group who developed the current plans for the church and church grounds we have now. MCL Construction, with an office in Kearney, will assist us in constructing Phase II. Our hope is to break ground after Easter this year!

To date, 318 families have responded to the Pillar Phase II with a total of \$2,524,426.00 pledged. \$1,239,373.00 is been collected and is earning great interest.

The Phase II committee continues to meet. As plans become available, they will be shared. Please save the date for January 28th & 29th after all the Masses for Town Hall meetings to discuss the Phase II plans and answer questions. Coffee and donuts will be provided.

Prince of Peace has several weddings each year. The new gathering space will allow wedding parties to have comfortable space in which to wait as they enter into the church. Currently attendants and groomsmen stand in line in the northwest stairway. The bride waits in the vesting sacristy, the small room by the elevator. After weddings, there will be room for a receiving line.

Weddings are joyful occasions in the church; there are also sorrowful ones, like a funeral. A gathering space will allow room for the family to join together as they enter the church. It is part of the ritual that the priest meets family members at the door for the blessing of the casket and the placing of the funeral pall. Currently, loved ones enter via the northwest stairs and wait on the steps until the immediate family can enter the church.


