

In December, donations to the pantry helped pay utility bills totaling \$565.65. Seven families were assisted with rent totaling \$845. Thirty-three families came to the pantry with food needs, and we were able to feed 137 of their family members. There were no miscellaneous expense items this month. The generous Advent calendar gifts eliminated several trips for groceries.
