





PASTOR'S NOTE FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME | FEBRUARY 5, 2023

The feast of the Presentation of the Lord occurs February 2nd, 40 days after Christmas. The Jewish tradition is that a child shall be presented in the Temple 40 days after birth. It is called Candle Mass or Candlemas day, as it is also the tradition that parishioners bring their candles to be blessed.

February 3rd is the Feast of St. Blaise, who is best known as the patron saint of people with sore throats. On this day, in many places, people gather in churches for the blessing of throats.

St. Blasius was a bishop who suffered martyrdom at the beginning of the fourth century. According to the legend, Blasius was a physician at Sebaste before he was raised to the episcopal see. At the time of the persecution under Licinius he was taken prisoner at the command of the governor, Agricolaus. The hunters of the governor found him in the wilderness in a cave. While in prison, he performed a wonderful cure of a boy who had a fishbone in his throat and who was in danger of choking to death. After suffering various forms of torture St. Blasius was beheaded.

We will bless throats after Masses on February 4th and 5th. Using two crossed and unlighted candles, the priest (or other minister) touches the throat of each person, saying: Through the intercession of Saint Blaise, bishop and martyr, may God deliver you from all ailments of the throat and from every other evil: + in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.






Lenten Study Group—Bridges to Contemplative Living with Thomas Merton


