

How to find Joy in Lent.

A paraphrase of a Catholic Up-date by Jack Wintz, O.F.M.



Here are Seven Lenten Practices that will help you have a joyful Lent.

Start all prayers with praise and thanks.

God's goodness existed before your need. Note that the Lord's Prayer begins with "Hallowed be thy name" and only asks later for "daily bread." Every day take a moment to praise God for life and give thanks for all the many blessings in your life. In other words have an attitude of gratitude.

Spend time with God in a beautiful place.

Our church is a beautiful sacred space that many enjoy visiting. Other places you might rest with the Lord are a park, near a lake, an art museum, in your pasture. If you can not go out, enjoy a lighted candle, fresh flowers, looking out the window. Remember God is the creator we are God's creation. Savor God's creation during Lent.

Don't carry all the world's pain on your own back.

We fast from meat during lent perhaps we can fast from worrying about everything. There are many world problems. We can not solve them all. Trust that the Good Shepherd, who loves the sheep, is with us even in the dark valleys.

Fast for the sake of richer food.

Set your alarm early or cut back on your lunch break to create a time in your life to enjoy the great banquet, the Eucharist at Mass. Sign up for Eucharistic Adoration.

Share some of your time with someone.

Call your parents or a family member. Check in on a neighbor. Visit someone who may be sick. Make a card or write a note to a co-worker. All these things can bring them and you joy.

Make an effort to forgive someone who has hurt you and be reconciled with them.

Forgiveness isn't easy. We know we are to forgive as we are forgiven...but many times it is difficult, sometimes it seems impossible. Begin with prayer for the willingness to forgive. Then mentally forgive them and, when possible, forgive them in person. For me forgiveness is the secret to a happy life.

Smile, look for the good, and make the world a better place.

It is easy to see what is wrong in the world. Look for the good in others and in yourself. Smile and the world will smile with you.

Mix it all with prayer. Remember when God mixes with us, great things happen! May you have a blessed Lent!
