Pastor's Notes

The Gospel for this weekend, the 3rd Sunday of Easter, is the Emmaus story. To summarize briefly, two of the disciples of Jesus were traveling to Emmaus. They had just witnessed the agony of Jesus' death on the cross. Presumably they were leaving Jerusalem before it got really bad. Jesus joined them as they walked, although they didn't recognize him. They were incredulous that he didn't know what had happened in Jerusalem. Then Jesus began with Moses and all the prophets and interpreted to them all the scriptures that referred to him. They were stopping for the night meal. He acted as if he were going further. They pressed him to stay to share a meal. During the meal it was at the breaking of the bread that they recognized him.

This story echoes what happens at the Mass; we gather, we listen to God's word, then after the fraction rite, the breaking of the bread, we receive the Eucharist, communion. We encounter Jesus in word and the Eucharist, the body, blood, soul and divinity of Jesus.

At the Easter Vigil Damien Montgomery was received in the church through Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist. Riley Harris, Jennifer Carper and Spencer Noble made a profession of faith in the Roman Catholic Church. They were confirmed and made their First Communion. Now they have the time of Mystagogy.

From Fr. Paul Turner: Mystagogy is a period of postbaptismal catechesis. It usually coincides with the 50 days of Easter. Unbaptized adults and children of catechetical age celebrate the three sacraments of initiation at the Easter Vigil. That night they are baptized, receive Confirmation, and share in the Eucharist for the first time. To prepare for that evening, they have spent a long time in catechetical formation, learning how to act, think, and believe as Christians do. After their Baptism, in the midst of the entire community, their formation continues for a while. That period is called "Mystagogy."

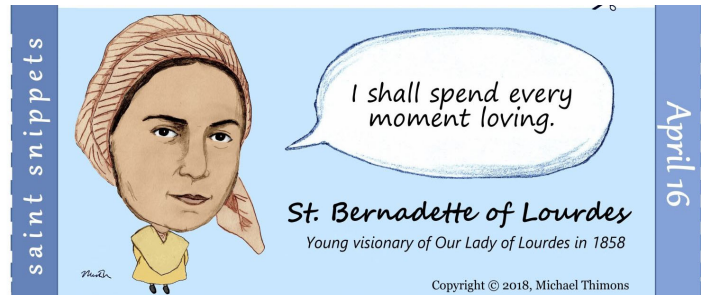
Mystagogy invites the newly baptized to participate more deeply in all the things that Christians do—meditating on the gospel, sharing in the Eucharist, and performing charity. In all this, they let the meaning of the death and resurrection of Christ take firm root in their lives. Of course, catechumens are expected to behave as Christians even before they are baptized. They should be turning away from a life of sin and turning toward Christ, establishing him as their center. But after Baptism things are different. Now they are truly one with the Christian Community, even to the point of sharing in the Eucharist. With the power of the sacraments, the newly baptized are better able to live as Christians and to reflect on the gospel and its effect on their lives in a more complete way.
