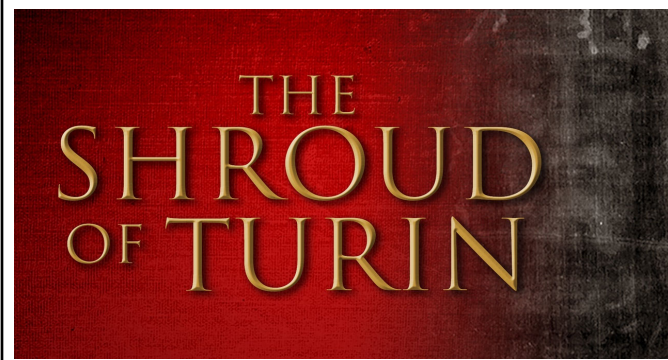

SHROUD OF TURIN

Spirit Catholic Radio is bringing to Prince of Peace an up-close experience of the most studied artifact of all time – The Shroud of Turin, what many believe to be the authentic burial cloth of Christ. Their newest traveling exhibit, **The Man of the Shroud**, will include 42 beautifully-designed panels on display in the Parish Hall from **June 6 – June 11**. Viewing times are after the Sunday presentation, Mon-Thurs 9 am—5 pm, Fri 9 am-1 pm, This exhibit will raise the questions, *“Could the Shroud be the most important archaeological artifact ever found? Does it provide clues to what happened during the crucifixion and resurrection of Jesus?”* On **June 6**, at 4pm, Shroud expert, **Jim Bertrand**, M.Ed. of the American Confraternity of the Holy Shroud, will give a special presentation and a rare viewing of a Shroud replica, as well as replicas of the Crown of Thorns, whips, nails and Holy Sponge used in the Passion of Our Lord. SUNDAY MASS AND HOLY DAYS OF OBLIGATION IS REINSTATED

Which means we are obligated to attend Mass.

Please stay home if you are sick, have a fever, or are in a health risk category and have not received the COVID-19 vaccinations. Communion may be taken to you if you so desire. If one is sick the obligation to attend mass is lifted.

Prince of Peace will follow CDC recommendations about mask wearing. We will change our guidelines accordingly.

This is a brief summary of the new mask guidelines from the CDC:
Fully vaccinated people can resume outdoor and most indoor activities without wearing a mask or physically distancing, except where required by applicable laws and regulations. Masks are recommended for anyone not vaccinated, but not required. Keep taking all precautions until you are fully vaccinated.

The United States Catholic Bishops have written "receiving the COVID-19 vaccine ought to be understood as an act of charity toward the other members of our community. In this way, being vaccinated safely against COVID-19 should be considered an act of love of our neighbor and part of our moral responsibility for the common good." 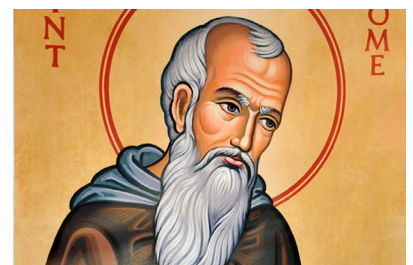

FEAST OF FAITH

Liturgy and the Holy Trinity

The Trinity is the central mystery of our faith. We believe that God is one, yet three: total unity and rich diversity. God is not a monolith, but a dynamic community of persons, a perfect, loving harmony of three. And the liturgy is the work of the Trinity. We begin all our liturgical celebrations with the sign of the cross, a reminder of our Trinitarian baptism, and the simplest of all professions of our faith. We believe that God is Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, and we gather in the name of this triune God. Throughout the Mass, we address our prayers to God the Father, through Christ our Lord, in the Spirit's power. And the Father hears our prayer, transforming bread and wine into the Body and Blood of his Son by the Holy Spirit. The Church is "the sacrament of Trinitarian communion." (Sacramentum Caritatis, 16). It is the Trinity who holds us together as well. In the words of Saint Cyprian, we are "a people made one by the unity of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit" (quoted in Sacramentum Caritatis, 16).

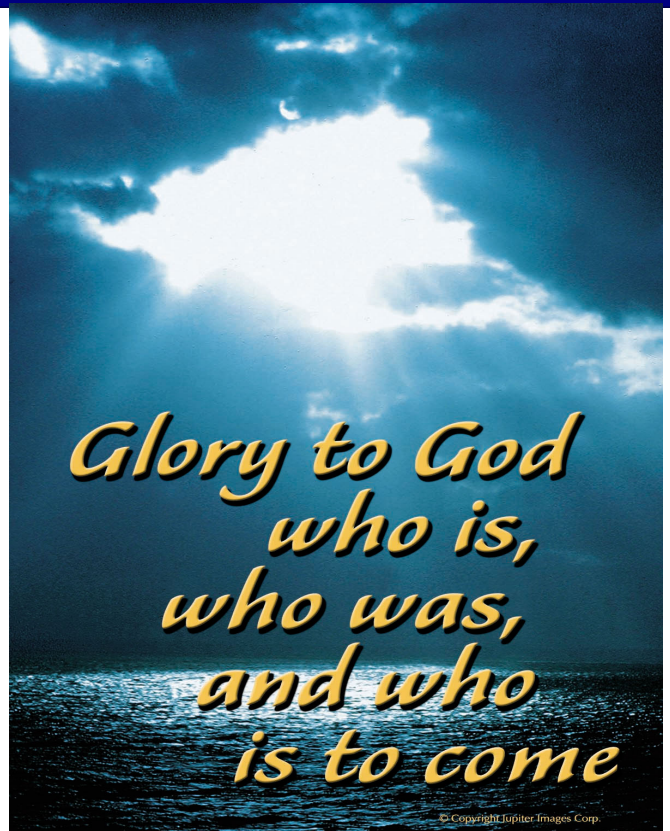


THE MYSTERY OF THE BLESSED TRINITY

Today we celebrate the solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. The Church sets aside this Sunday to focus our attention on the mystery of the Blessed Trinity, God who is one, but three persons—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

The first reading from Deuteronomy emphasizes both God's awesome greatness and amazing nearness. It might seem beyond belief, but the God of all creation speaks to us, protects us, and guides us. The second reading from Saint Paul's Letter to the Romans describes how we are to relate to the three persons who are one God. We are led by the Spirit to meet God the Father as adopted children. Our adoption is such that we are even heirs with our brother, Christ, the second person of the Trinity, in whose sufferings we must also share. In Matthew's Gospel, Jesus speaks with his authority as God and sends us to teach and baptize in the name of the Trinity.

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“The Spirit itself bears witness with our spirit that we are children of God, and if children then heirs, heirs of God and joint heirs with Christ...”

Romans 8:16-17

If we are heirs to the kingdom of God, shouldn't we work to build up His kingdom? Shouldn't we be good stewards of our inheritance, using our time in prayer, our talent in charitable works and our treasure to care for the Church that God has left to us? Our Church is a treasured heirloom from God. Do we treat it that way?

We invite you to be present Sunday, June 6th at 3pm at an Interfaith Memorial Service honoring infants who have died during pregnancy. The Memorial Service will be held near Babyland on the East side of the Kearney Cemetery at the Good Samaritan Hospital Memorial Site. CHI Health Good Samaritan believes each life is precious and will be remembering all of God's children, regardless of their span of life in days, weeks, or months. Please be mindful that they will be following CDC's guidelines. We hope you will join and find some comfort and meaning in the Memorial Service.
