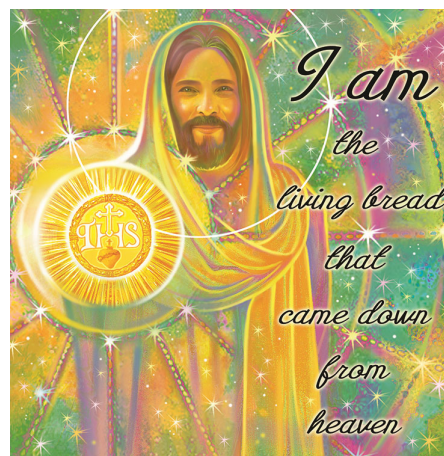

Emergency Food Assistance Program

This food assistance program supports patients with cancer, multiple sclerosis or rheumatoid arthritis who are unable to afford or access food or nutritional needs due to COVID-19. Qualified patients will receive a one-time grant in the amount of \$500 to cover groceries, food delivery or pick-up, and medically tailored meals and can request complimentary delivery of food and other critical supplies directly to their place of residence by one of TR's Greyshirt volunteers. Eligible patients include those who are undergoing active treatment, scheduled to begin treatment in 60 days, or have been in treatment in the last 6 months. Each patient must also be a US citizen or permanent resident, residing in the US or a US territory.

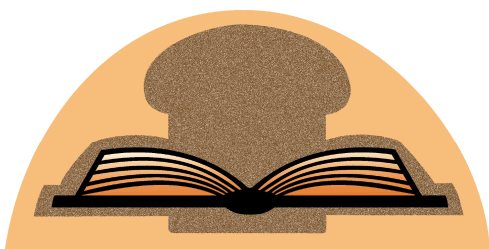
Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 10:16-17

**COVID-19 is still with us...if you choose to attend Mass you do so at your own risk.
Please stay home if you are sick or high risk. Homebound ministry is suspended until further notice.**

**The Mass will still be available for praying/viewing on the parish website,
the YouTube parish channel and Facebook.
Protocols will be in place to assist us in providing the safest environment possible.
Do not expect our church to be any safer than other public spaces.**

**Those who are considered high risk are encouraged to stay home
(this is for your protection and the protection of others):**

1. People with underlying medical conditions
2. People who live with elderly people or those who are at-risk
3. People who have access to those at-risk in nursing institutions, hospitals, assisted living facilities
4. People who have a fever or have upper respiratory flu-like symptoms
5. People with COVID-19 or live with someone who has COVID-19
6. People who have been exposed to someone with COVID-19

GENERAL INFORMATION TO KNOW BEFORE ATTENDING MASS

The Governor has directed everyone to keep the 6-foot social distance rule which is approximately 200 for Prince of Peace.

- ◆ **Patience:** This is uncharted territory for us. We all will be asked to accommodate and adapt to the extra cautions and protections that will be put in place. These sacrifices are in the best interest of us all.
- ◆ The Mass schedule remains the same: Saturday at 5 pm; Sunday 8 am and 10:30 am.
- ◆ There will be a Wednesday Mass at 6:00 pm for those who are unable to attend on Sunday ([a mask is required at this Mass](#)).
- ◆ Unless there is a funeral and until further notice, weekday Masses are Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday at 12:05 pm, which will be live streamed in the main body of the church.

PROCEDURES FOR ATTENDING MASS

Some of these guidelines may push your comfort level or personal ideas
but we would be so much obliged if you would follow them.

- ◆ Everyone is expected to wear a mask (masks are available for you at the doors if you don't have one). Several times in his directives, the Bishop encourages those attending Mass to wear masks. It is our expectation that you follow his encouragement.
- ◆ Use the 6-foot distancing rule when entering into the church.
- ◆ Use the west doors to enter the church. For those who don't mind walking, we encourage you to park on the east side of the church and walk to the west doors.
- ◆ The restrooms are available for you at your own risk. We ask that only one person or one adult and child at a time. Please use the restroom before you come to church.
- ◆ Pick up a bulletin when you arrive. The Worship Aid is included in the bulletin.
- ◆ Use the 6-foot distancing rule; every other pew will be used. The pews are marked to allow you to visualize the 6 foot sections.
- ◆ Do not sit in the roped off sections.
- ◆ The front will be filled up before the back.
- ◆ An usher will be available by the baptismal font to answer any questions.
- ◆ There will be baskets near the doors for your offering, since we won't be passing the offering basket, or you may take advantage of the on-line giving.
- ◆ If you choose to hold hands during the Our Father, you may do so only with your family.
- ◆ The sign of Peace will be done only with your family. You may give a symbol of peace or wave to those around you if you choose.

PROCEDURES FOR RECEIVING COMMUNION

- ◆ Instructions will be given at Mass.
- ◆ There will be an usher to guide you.
- ◆ Use the 6-foot distancing rule (families may go up together and thus be closer to each other).
- ◆ The side aisles will be used for returning to your pew.
- ◆ Those sitting in the north or south transepts will receive directions specific for your location when you are in church.

PROCEDURES FOR DISMISSAL

- ◆ Before you leave, please clean your pew with the supplies provided.
- ◆ As you leave church, please continue to practice social distancing.
- ◆ There are baskets near the entrance of the church for your offerings.
- ◆ Recycle your worship aid or take it home and throw away disposable masks in the waste container provided.
- ◆ Go to your vehicles immediately after Mass. We discourage congregating in the parking lot after Mass.
