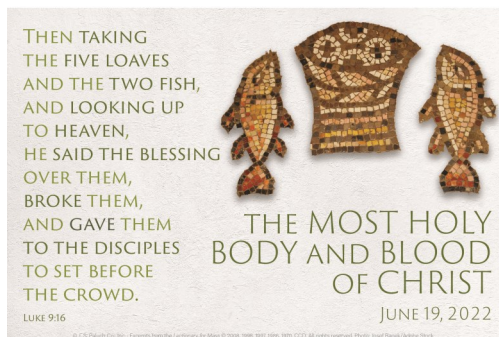

Catholic Community Food Pantry at Prince of Peace Church

In May, 43 families came to the pantry with food needs, and 138 of their family members were fed. \$584.49 in utility bills were paid, and \$125 in car repairs. Food purchases totaling \$665.71 were also made. Young families in need of help to keep up with inflation this summer can use the Summer Food Program which began on June 6th. At least 5 local schools have volunteers serving breakfast and lunch every day (except July 4th). Thank you for the incredible support we receive at the pantry. Come Holy Ghost and set our hearts on fire!

Prince of Peace received a thank you letter from the Catholic Extension for our recent gift of \$3,413 to our Catholic sisters and brothers in the Ukraine. 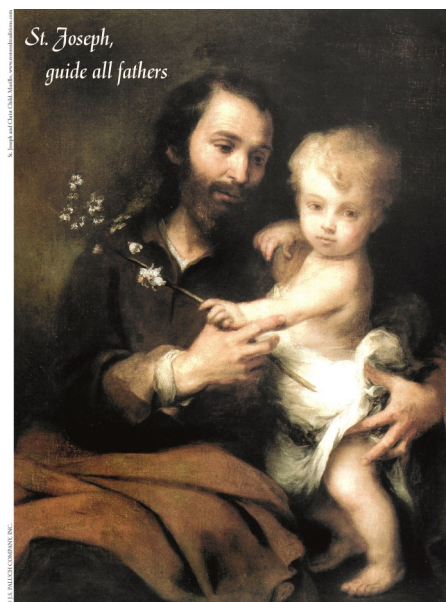

YEAR OF DIOCESAN REVIVAL

June 19, 2022 – June 11, 2023

This first year of the Revival invites diocesan staff, bishops, and priests to respond to the Lord’s personal invitation and equips them to share this love with the faithful through Eucharistic congresses and events

YEAR OF PARISH REVIVAL

June 11, 2023 – July 17, 2024

The second phase will foster Eucharistic devotion at the parish level, strengthening our liturgical life through faithful celebration of the Mass, Eucharistic Adoration, missions, resources, preaching, and organic movements of the Holy Spirit.

NATIONAL EUCHARISTIC CONGRESS

July 17 – 21, 2024

Indianapolis, Indiana

At this historic event, more than 80,000 Catholics of all ages will gather in Indianapolis to re-consecrate their hearts to the source and summit of our faith.

Religious freedom allows the Church, and all religious communities, to live out their faith in public and to serve the good of all. Beginning June 22 the feasts of Saints Thomas More and John Fisher, the USCCB invites Catholics to pray, reflect, and act to promote religious freedom.

June 22: Walking with Moms in Need: Pray that the local churches and communities will have the vision and the freedom to walk with moms in need.

June 23: Church Vandalism: Pray that Christians witness in the face of attacks on our church will convert to faith in Jesus Christ

June 24: Adoption and Foster Care: Pray that people of faith will continue to have the freedom to serve in the life affirming ministry of adoption and foster care.

June 25: Taxpayer Funding for Abortion: Pray that civic leaders would promote life and dignity for all.

June 26: Religious Freedom in China: Pray for the freedom of the church in China, and that the rights of all religious minorities would be respected.

June 27: Pregnancy Resource Centers: Pray that women facing unplanned pregnancies will continue to have access to support from people who choose life
