In the gospel of St. Mark 6: 30-34, Jesus welcomed the disciples from their mission trip! They were successful! They worked hard and Jesus invited them to go off to a deserted place for much needed rest. Jesus teaches us that we need to be attune to take time to rest and recreate!

We are well into the lazy, hazy, crazy days of summer. Summer is when many of us take time out to recreate, relax, and go on vacation. However, if we are not careful, our vacations can be just as busy as a regular work week!

It is important that we take digestible helpings of life and fun. One way of doing this is being present in the moment. Instead of thinking of what is next, savor the moment. That can be breakfast by the lake or in the back yard. After a fun day at an amusement park, families might take time to rest and share photos and talk about their favorite parts of the day. There are many creative ways to recharge your batteries. The danger is trying to put too much in one day.

As Catholics we must be careful not to take a vacation from prayer. Prayer is our connection to the source of grace that can renew and energize us.

Our major prayer is Sunday Mass. It is very easy to find out where Sunday Mass is with the internet; www.masstimes.org is one site. It can be enjoyable seeing different churches, experiencing the music, the sermon, the congregation. While driving to your destination you could start by saying a little prayer. If it is a long drive, you could pray a rosary or listen to spiritual music. If you have little ones, you could make a game of naming the books of the Bible, or reviewing the Ten Commandments. A custom in my family was to bless ourselves when we drove by a Catholic church. I am sure you have your own. If you don't have one, why not start today? Let's not take a vacation from our prayer life.

This has been a very dry year, and many are suffering because of the lack of rain. It is good to be mindful of our water usage. It is a great resource that God has given us and we are called to be good stewards. Even though many are comparing this dry time to the drought in the 1930's, some question why it does not seem that bad. I heard on the news this is due to the techniques that many are using to conserve water and land. Indeed our farmers, ranchers, and gardeners have become good stewards. We pray that we soon get the much needed rain. In my research of the patron saint for rain, the best I could do was St. Clare of Assisi and St. Isidore the farmer. We pray for rain to meet our needs!
