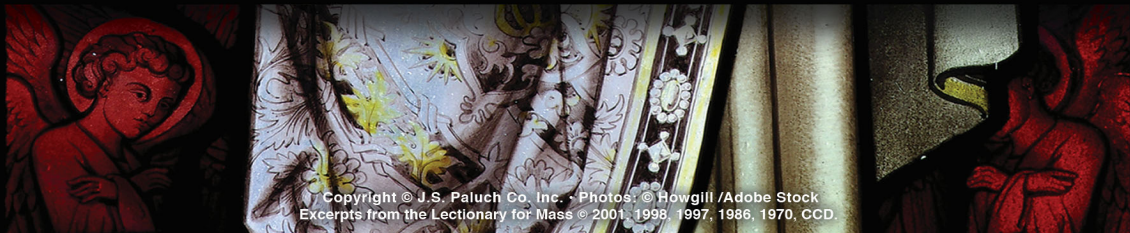

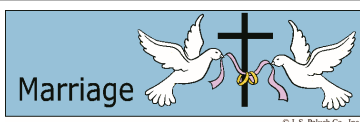

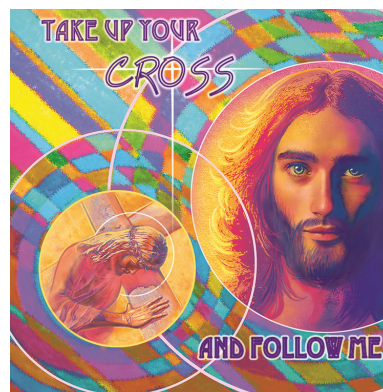

First Reading: Jeremiah 20:7-9

Pastor's Note: Although attending school is very different this year than it has been in the past, for all levels, school is back in session and along with its many activities. It is a fast paced life for those who have children, especially those in middle school and high school. My youngest sister has four children. They are so active her email is fourkidsontherun!

In this time of pandemic, I can only imagine what your lives are like. Unfortunately, many people are struggling to make ends meet. Some people are working from home, while others are working in environments that require masks, social distancing, and frequent hand-washing. All in all, this time of pandemic is very draining on us even in the best of circumstances. How can we handle this new age?

Jesus lived an active life, yet he sprinkled his life with prayer. He often went to a secluded place to pray, and this time with God rejuvenated him. Although it can be very helpful, we don't have to go to a secluded spot. We can pray anytime and anywhere during the day. The church is open Monday through Thursday until 9:00 pm, and on Fridays until 5:00 pm. It is a peaceful place one can pray in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament. When my parents were taking us to school, we often said a prayer... frequently the Rosary, as it took us over 20 minutes to get to school. Some families play Christian songs, pray the Rosary, or pray a chaplet while traveling from here to there. If work or school get stressful, take a moment to quiet yourself and say a short prayer like, "Jesus, Son of God, have mercy on me," or "Jesus help me," or whatever comes to mind. Life is fragile...handle it with prayer.

Prince of Peace is a dynamic and vibrant parish. Wednesday, September 9th we will kick off our religious formation programs at 4:00 pm and 5:30 pm, with Edge (middle school) beginning at 7:00 pm. On September 13th, the Sunday religious formation begins at 9:20 am, and LifeTeen (high school) at 7:00 pm. We are still accepting registrations for all levels of religious formation. We will bless the Catechists September 19th and September 20th at all the Masses. We are so grateful for their generous offering of their time and talent.

There is a song that goes, "The Spirit is moving, a moving all over, all over..." this certainly seems to be the case at Prince of Peace! Thanks be to God!

Faith Formation: Amy Lowe, our new Faith Formation Coordinator for grades K-5, comes to us with a wealth of experience. **She is in need of catechists and aids for all levels.** We will also be offering some on-line catechetical classes. More information will follow as we get it organized. Amy has posted on the website, the procedures for attending classes on site and there will be a hand out at the Parent Meeting on Sept. 2 at 7 pm. We are following the school's examples and will require masks to be worn at all times.

Stephen Friesell in the Youth Minister coordinator and Faith Formation Coordinator for 6th to 12th grades. He too has a wealth of experience and is excited to start the programs.

EDGE is our program for 6th to 8th grade.

LIFETEEN is our program for 9th to 12th grade. 11th grade is Pre-Confirmation and the Confirmation classes. The methodology for EDGE and LIFETEEN is a bit different from the traditional classroom model. The youth are welcomed with an exciting environment with icebreakers, prayer, a teaching, small group discussion, working together to apply what is learned, a wrap up, singing and prayer. It allows for inserting especial activities like a living rosary, Eucharistic Adoration, and community service projects. The environment at EDGE and LIFETEEN allows the youth to retain what they are learning about their faith. The young church of middle schoolers are sometimes on the edge of being forgotten. I invite you to bring them to our EDGE Nights to help them grow in their faith.

LIFETEEN is for the 'Older Young Church.' Please bring your 9th and 12th graders to enjoy life in a Catholic environment. They won't regret it.

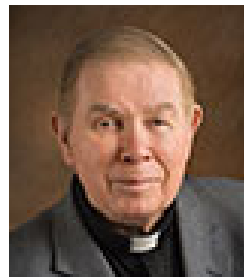

The Mass will still be available for praying/viewing on the parish website, the YouTube parish channel and Facebook.

Please stay home if you are sick, have a fever, are in the health-risk category, care for someone who is sick or vulnerable or have been exposed to COVID-19. Gathering in a public space, including our church, poses a risk of acquiring or transmitting the virus..

Procedures For Attending Mass

- ◆ Everyone is strongly encouraged to wear a mask (masks are available for you at the doors if you don't have one). **When singing please wear a mask.** The restrooms are available for you at your own risk. We ask that only one person or one adult & child go at a time. Please use the restroom before you come to church.
- ◆ Use the 6-foot distancing rule; every other pew is used. The pews are marked to allow you to visualize the 6 foot sections.
- ◆ There are baskets near the doors for your offering, since we won't pass the offering basket, or you may take advantage of the on-line giving.
- ◆ If you choose to hold hands during the Our Father, you may do so only with your family.
- ◆ The sign of Peace will be done only with your family. You may give a symbol of peace or wave to those around you if you choose.
- ◆ Communion will be distributed in the hand.
