

The church is in the second year of the Eucharistic Revival. Various activities have been planned, but I would like to see more. It has been a dream of mine that we might have more small groups. The USCCB is offering a seven-week small group study on the Eucharist. The studies are well laid out for even a novice group leader. Part of each session includes watching a DVD.

The evening would include: an opening prayer, a time to behold the beauty of the divine mystery such a scriptural or liturgical text, a work of art or a piece of music. All of the resources can be downloaded.

In order to have this dream come true we are in need of group leaders. Would you consider leading a group? Kathy White is assisting with this project, along with the Liturgy and ASET committees. Please prayerfully consider helping our parish with this worthy event. In order to finish before Christmas, the first session would need to start sometime the week of October 19<sup>th</sup>. Currently, there are no groups meeting in the parish hall placed in it, and then in the monstrance. on Monday or Thursday evenings.

Last Sunday, Confirmation class focused on the real presence of the Eucharist, Adoration, and Benediction. It seems to me that parishioners might benefit from these as well.

Adoration of the Holy Eucharist begins at Mass. Every week, we adore the Eucharist after it is consecrated by the priest. The people make a procession towards the minister of the Eucharist.

The General Instruction of the Roman Missal tells us: "the consecrated host may be received either on the tongue or in the hand at the discretion of each communicant. When Holy Communion is received under both kinds, the sign of reverence is also made before receiving the Precious Blood" (#160). That sign is usually a simple but reverent bow. When the communicant returns to their seat, they may kneel or sit in personal contemplation of receiving the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Christ.

Adoration may be done outside of Mass. In every Catholic church there is a Sanctuary light near the Tabernacle indicating the real presence of Jesus in the consecrated hosts that are reserved in a sacred vessel such as a ciborium. A ciborium often looks like a chalice but may be a round container. In all instances, it must have a lid.

"Furthermore, the sacred species are reserved after Mass principally so that the faithful who cannot be present at Mass, above all the sick and those advanced in age, may be united by sacramental Communion to Christ and his Sacrifice which is offered in the Mass. In addition, this reservation also permits the practice of adoring this great Sacrament and offering it the worship

due to God. Accordingly, forms of adoration that are not only private but also public and communitarian in nature, as established or approved by the Church herself, and promoted." S. Congregation for Divine Worship, Decree, Eucharistiae sacramentum, 21 June 1973: AAS 65 (1973) 610.

Prince of Peace church is open daily for adoration of the Eucharist while present in the Tabernacle. The beauty and the sacredness of the church is an ideal place to be present to the Lord without the distractions of the world.

Our parish also offers adoration with exposition weekly on Thursdays from 8 am to Midnight, and Fridays from 8 am until 5 pm.

Exposition is when the consecrated host is placed in a monstrance or an ostensorium. Both words have their roots in Latin meaning to show or display. In the monstrance, the host is placed in a *luna*, a round container with a glass door that allows the host to be





An ostensorium has a clip that holds the consecrated host so that when it is placed in the ostensorium it does not touch the glass.



As noted earlier in the bulletin, October 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> will be special days for adoration during which we pray for life of the unborn.
