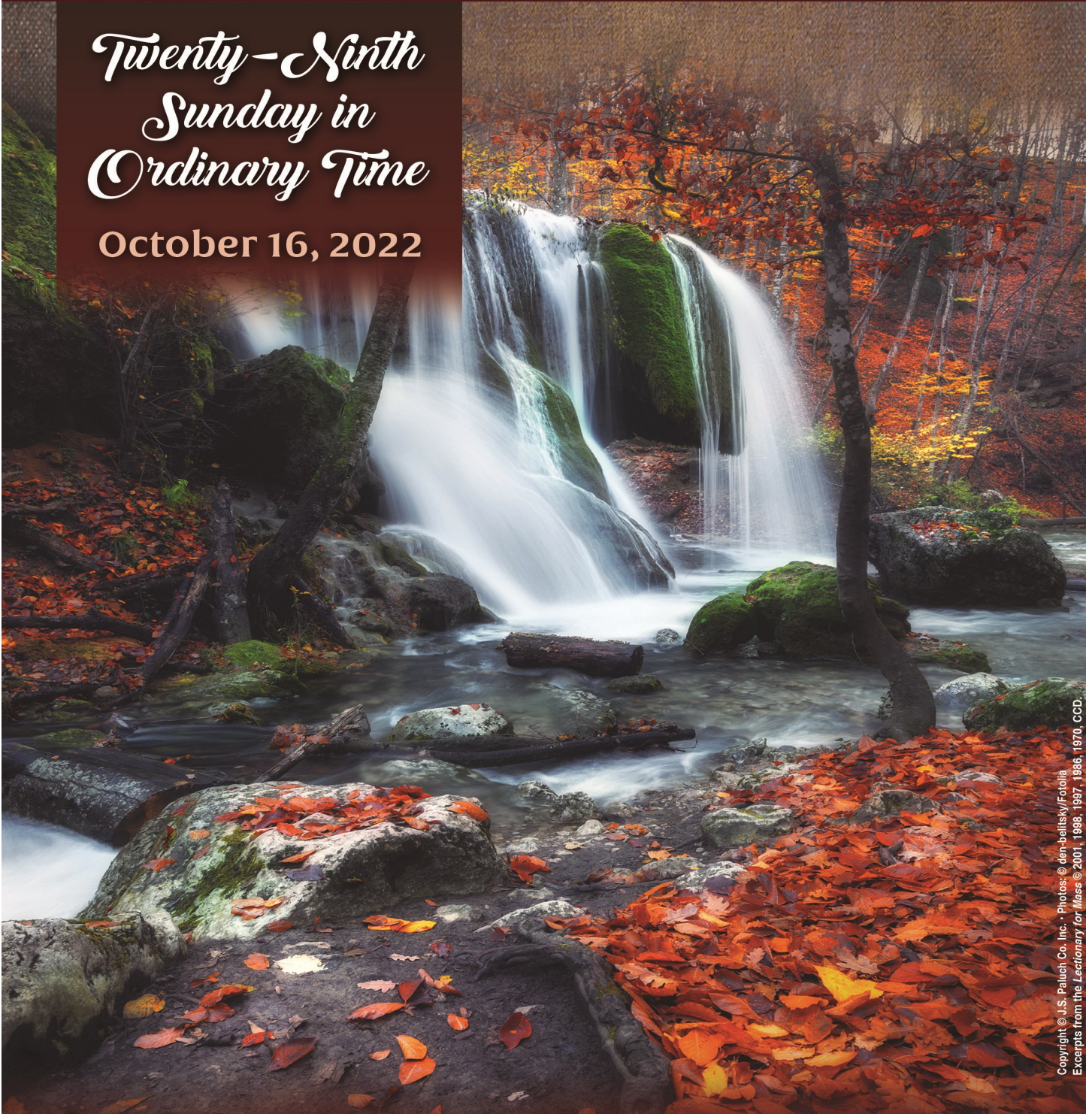

Pastor's note: Greetings from the Holy Vatican City! I arrived in Rome last Monday, October 3. The flight was pleasant, and the Institute of Continuing Education had someone meet me at the airport and take me to the school. After brief introductions it was time for lunch or what they call pranzo.

Pranzo, for the priests on sabbatical and the seminarians, is found in the refectory (from the Latin *reficere* "to remake or restore"), in short, the dining hall. It was there I met up with Noah Huddleston who began his first year of seminary at the North American College. He sends his greetings!

After getting settled in the Casa O'Toole, my new home for the next few weeks, I began getting to know the other priests. There are 30 priests here. Fr. Edward Linton, Order of Saint Benedict (OSB) is the director. He and I attended St. Meinrad seminary, although he was quite a few years behind me. It is good to reconnect.

Fr. Dan Rayer, a priest of the Lincoln, Diocese is also here. He was the chancellor of the Diocese of Grand Island. His grandparents lived in McCook. And Fr. Rayer is my brother David's nephew by marriage. Yes, indeed it is a small world.

The theme of the sabbatical is the Passion of Christ. We began by exploring Palm Sunday, Holy Week and the Triduum (specifically Good Friday and Holy Saturday morning). Since our world doesn't revolve so much around church, we all agreed it is challenging to embrace Holy Week as we would like. There was much food for thought!

Wednesday, we got up bright and early. It is a tradition that the class celebrate Mass in a chapel in the lower level of St. Peter's Basilica. Then we got to wander around in St. Peter's Basilica. It is an incredible place to go visit; its beauty is

indescribable and one truly senses the presence of God. It is one of our Church's treasures!

Part of a sabbatical is to take time to reflect, to pray and to rest. This weekend has been just that for me. Sunday, I joined the seminarians for Mass in their chapel. It was a beautiful Mass! It is an honor to concelebrate with the rector and other priests.

It is tradition that after Sunday Mass the seminarians and/or priests from a particular state sit together for Pranzo (lunch). On Sunday it is a brunch. There are two seminarians from the Archdiocese of Omaha and one from the diocese of Lincoln. We enjoyed getting to know each other.

Our seminarian Noah is settling in well. This summer he lived in Assisi and studied Italian. His classes are taught in Italian. They started their first week of classes last Monday. He seems to be adjusting well. Imagine learning theology in Italian!

In our orientation Fr. Edward reminded us that we are not here because we deserve or earned it. It is not a vacation. It is a time for us enrich ourselves that we may better serve our people. My heart is full of gratitude. Although I miss you, I believe the Lord has me where I need to be so that I may return renewed and refreshed to better serve you as your priest and pastor. Know you are in my daily prayers.

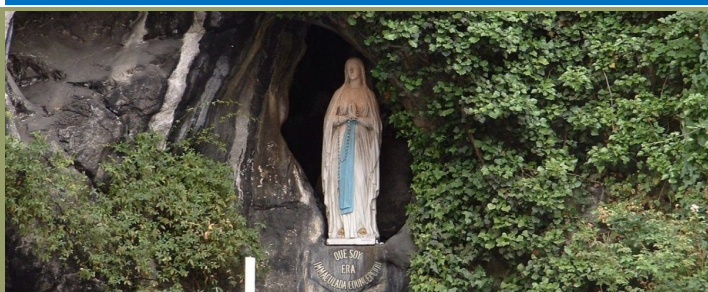

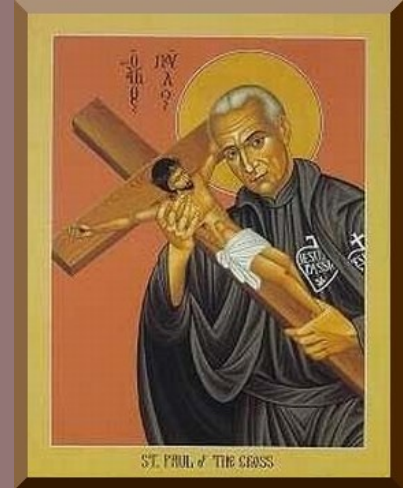
