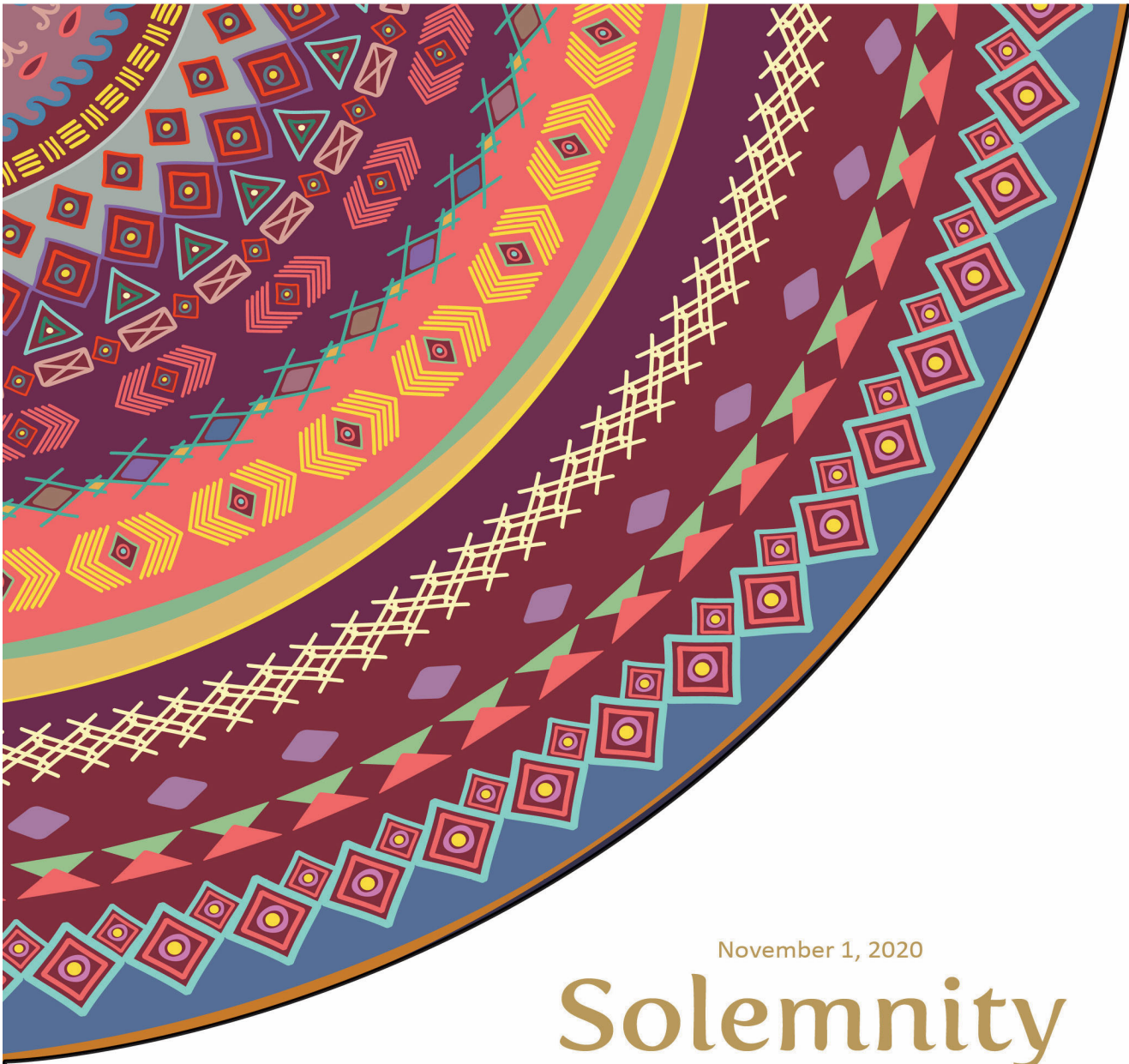

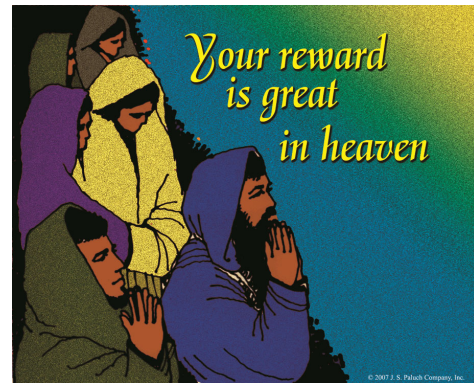

A Stewardship Moment

In today's Gospel, Jesus teaches his followers about "blessedness," a word not used much in American culture. The Beatitudes Jesus evokes in this Gospel reading are not promises of happiness, but promises of a new life with God; blessedness is key to a new way of living through the human experiences of mourning, meekness, peacemaking, persecution, and poverty of spirit. For Christian stewards, "blessedness" does not depend on wealth or health or status. Rather, Christian stewards recognize that blessedness is God's gift. In the kingdom of God, life is not governed by honor and fame, but by the promise of abundant life. Embracing a poverty of spirit and meekness reveal God's abundant life "breaking into" our world. Reflect on the Beatitudes this week. How might they help us improve our relationship with the Lord?

All Saints

First Reading: Revelation 7:2-4, 9-14

I, John, saw another angel come up from the East, holding the seal of the living God. He cried out in a loud voice to the four angels who were given power to damage the land and the sea, “Do not damage the land or the sea or the trees until we put the seal on the foreheads of the servants of our God.” I heard the number of those who had been marked with the seal, one hundred and forty-four thousand marked from every tribe of the children of Israel.

After this I had a vision of a great multitude, which no one could count, from every nation, race, people, and tongue. They stood before the throne and before the Lamb, wearing white robes and holding palm branches in their hands. They cried out in a loud voice: “Salvation comes from our God, who is seated on the throne, and from the Lamb.” All the angels stood around the throne and around the elders and the four living creatures. They prostrated themselves before the throne, worshiped God, and exclaimed: “Amen. Blessing and glory, wisdom and thanksgiving, honor, power, and might be to our God forever and ever. Amen.” Then one of the elders spoke up and said to me, “Who are these wearing white robes, and where did they come from?” I said to him, “My lord, you are the one who knows.” He said to me “These are the ones who have survived the time of great distress; they have washed their robes and made them white in the Blood of the Lamb.”

Pastor's Note

This weekend is All Saints' Day. What a wonderful weekend to celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation. We ask those who are to be confirmed to choose a Saint's name. This choosing a new name when one is confirmed, is rooted in our Catholic tradition as a sign and symbol that those who are confirmed are receiving special graces and gifts to become a different person. If the candidate says yes to cooperating with God's will and grace he or she is able to serve God in a special way with a new charism.

We ask the candidates to research and find a Saint that can inspire them to become closer to God. I recall when I was young I read historical fiction books about the lives of the Saints. The Jesuits that were missionaries to the United States were particularly inspiring for me. Now I am somewhat partial to Padre Pio. Who is the Saint that you look up too? I have heard it said that it helps to find a Saint that has similar interests to us and a Saint that is different than us; to affirm and challenge us.

This is also the beginning of National Vocations week. Saints Isaac Jogues, Jean de Brébeuf and six other martyred missionaries, all Jesuit priests or laymen associated with them, were all martyred for the faith. They inspired me! I believe that assisted me in my vocation to the priesthood.

Imagine all the Saints in heaven enjoying all eternity. If you were to speak with them, I imagine they would tell you that their most important decision, aside from following Jesus, was finding and living their vocation.

Discovering your vocation is answering the question: Who does God want me to bring with me to heaven? St. John Paul II states, "Each one of you must be holy also in order to help your brother and sister pursue their vocation to sanctity." taken from the Vianney Vocation Website.

So you may be wondering what you can do to inspire vocations? In a CARA study of the 2020 ordination class, 89% of the newly ordained priests said they were encouraged to consider the seminary by their parish priest, a friend or another parishioner. That would be all you reading this. If you see a young man or woman who seems to have that special quality to be a priest or a nun, first pray for him or her. Then when you have an opportunity let that person know that you think they would be a good priest or sister, and why. Remember, gently encourage but please don't push.

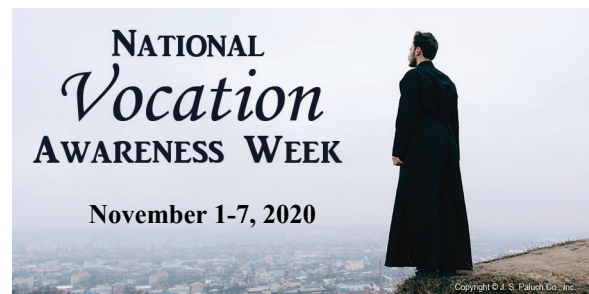

Procedures For Attending Mass

- ◆ Everyone is expected to wear a mask (masks are available for you at the doors if you don't have one). **Especially when singing please wear a mask.** The restrooms are available for you at your own risk. We ask that only one person or one adult & child go at a time. Please use the restroom before you come to church.
- ◆ Use the 6-foot distancing rule; every other pew is used. The pews are marked to allow you to visualize the 6 foot sections.
- ◆ There are baskets near the doors for your offering, since we won't pass the offering basket, or you may take advantage of the on-line giving.
- ◆ If you choose to hold hands during the Our Father, you may do so only with your family.
- ◆ The sign of Peace will be done only with your family. You may give a symbol of peace or wave to those around you if you choose.
- ◆ Communion will be distributed in the hand.
