


Pastor's note: November 17th at the 10:30 am Mass, 35 total youth will receive the Sacrament of Confirmation. Some are from St. James as our class time was more convenient for them. Each of them had to write a paper about the Saint they chose and why they chose him or her. They also had to write a letter to Bishop Hanefeldt answering questions he requested. He read them all and was impressed with their enthusiasm for the faith and the love of our church community.

The last two weekends we have been talking about the Annual Diocesan Appeal. Our Bishop sent you a letter, a pamphlet, and a giving card. Please make the checks payable to the Grand Island Diocese. You may mail your donation to the chancery or you may bring it to church next weekend and put it in the offering basket. Those we receive will be mailed to the Diocese. We are a tithing parish. 
