Bishop Hanefeldt is Redirecting the CCHD (Catholic Campaign for Human Development) this year.

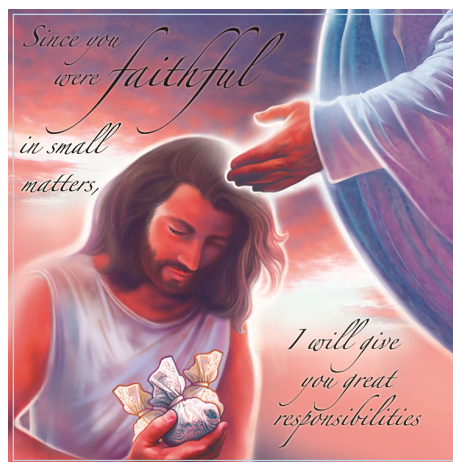

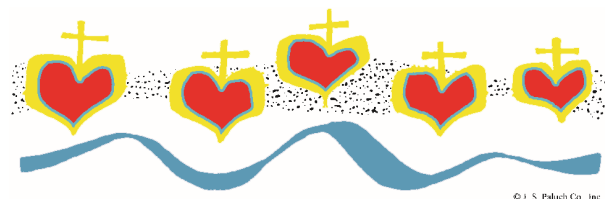
A Stewardship Moment

In today's Gospel, Jesus delivers the parable of the talents; using the example of money rather than abilities or skills. It's a story about investments, risks and returns. On November 1st at the 10:30 am Mass 23 youth received the Sacrament of Confirmation. In addition to over 20 weeks of classes each of them had to write a paper about the saint they chose and why they chose him or her. They also had to write a letter to Bishop Hanefeldt answering questions he requested. He read them all and was impressed with their enthusiasm for the faith and the love of our church community.

The last two weekends we have been talking about the Annual Diocesan Appeal. Our Bishop sent you a letter, a pamphlet, and a giving card. Please make the checks to the Diocese of Grand Island as it will not be recorded here at Prince of Peace as part of your annual giving. You may mail your donation to the Chancery (2708 Old Fair Rd, Grand Island, NE 68803) or you may bring it to church next weekend and put it in the offering basket. Those we receive will be mailed to the Diocese.

We are a tithing parish. When we faithfully and intentionally make a commitment to tithe, it becomes a part of our lifestyle. Tithing has helped me prioritize the difference between what "I need" vs. what "I want." In our world we can be so focused on what we want, that we forget the blessings of everything we have.

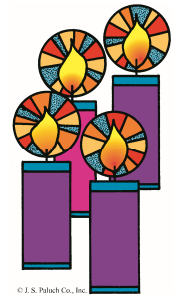
