### Worship of the Eucharist Outside of Mass:

Part II: From the ritual book *Holy Communion and Worship of the Eucharist Outside of Mass (HCW), 82.* "In addition to the celebration of the Mass, Eucharistic devotions are important for the life of the parish for they [invite] us to the spiritual union with him that culminates in the sacramental communion."

From the Guide for Celebrating Worship of the Eucharist Outside of Mass by Fr. John Thomas Lane with the Nihil Obstat being the Very Reverend Daniel A. Smilanic, JCD and the Imprimatur, the Very Reverend Ronald A. Hicks, both of the Archdiocese of Chicago, Fr. Lane notes that, "There is a difference between personal devotion to the Eucharist and the public rituals that occur outside of Mass". For example, the term **Eucharistic Adoration** is used to refer to all forms of Eucharist worship outside of the Mass. But there is a difference between personal piety and the liturgical rites which lead Fr. Lane to the defining of terms associated with prayer in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament which I found very illuminating. From Guide for Celebrating...pp.18-19.

- Adoration: a general term used to describe prayer in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament. This may be done with the Eucharist in the Tabernacle or exposed for the purpose of adoration.
- **Perpetual Adoration:** Perpetual adoration is devotional prayer that is repeatedly done with the church member attending to specific hours in the presence of the reserved Blessed Sacrament in front of or near the tabernacle. Because the Sacrament is not exposed, the parishes are not required to receive permission from the bishop when offering perpetual adoration.
- **Perpetual Exposition:** The Eucharist is exposed or visible in the monstrance for an extended period of time such as many days for 24 hours each day. This requires permission from the local Bishop and usually requires a special chapel.
- **Exposition and Benediction:** The Rite of Exposition and Benediction is a liturgical rite of the Catholic Church. A larger host is consecrated at Mass and later placed in a monstrance or ostensorium for communal prayer. It does involve adoration, following the act of exposition. Prayers may be offered privately or communal prayers may be offered such as the Liturgy of the Hours, reading of scripture, or singing hymns. Benediction concludes the service with the priest or deacon

blessing the people with the exposed host in the monstrance or ostensorium. This rite does not need permission from the bishop.

- **Eucharistic Processions:** A procession with the Blessed Sacrament exposed in the monstrance or ostensorium. It may move beyond the church and into the streets.
- **Eucharistic Congress:** A gathering of the local or international Church to study the Eucharist, celebrate the Mass, and pray in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament.
- **Genuflection:** In reverence to the Blessed Sacrament in the Tabernacle or when the Eucharist is exposed, the church asks that when one enters the pew before and after Mass to bend one knee to touch the ground to show reverence to the Blessed Sacrament. If one cannot do this due to age or a physical issue a profound bow may be done in reverence of the Blessed Sacrament. Genuflecting is not done during Mass, but before and after. Also, before 1973, it was customary to genuflect by kneeling on both knees when the Blessed Sacrament is exposed. In 1973, the rubric was changed. One is certainly allowed to do so, but not required.
