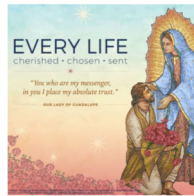

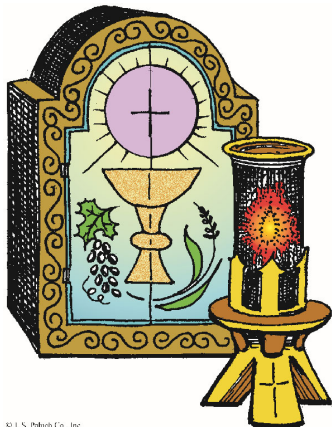

Christ, King of the Universe

First Reading: Ezekiel 34:11-12, 15-17

Thus says the Lord GOD: I myself will look after and tend my sheep. As a shepherd tends his flock when he finds himself among his scattered sheep, so will I tend my sheep. I will rescue them from every place where they were scattered when it was cloudy and dark. I myself will pasture my sheep; I myself will give them rest, says the Lord GOD. The lost I will seek out, the strayed I will bring back, the injured I will bind up, the sick I will heal, but the sleek and the strong I will destroy, shepherding them rightly.

As for you, my sheep, says the Lord GOD, I will judge between one sheep and another, between rams and goats.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 15:20-26, 28

Brothers and sisters: Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have fallen asleep. For since death came through man, the resurrection of the dead came also through man. For just as in Adam all die, so too in Christ shall all be brought to life, but each one in proper order: Christ, the firstfruits; then, at his coming, those who belong to Christ; then comes the end, when he hands over the kingdom to his God and Father, when he has destroyed every sovereignty and every authority and power. For he must reign until he has put all his enemies under his feet. The last enemy to be destroyed is death. When everything is subjected to him, then the Son himself will also be subjected to him, so that God may be all in all.

Jesus said to his disciples: “When the Son of Man comes in his glory, and all the angels with him, he will sit upon his glorious throne, and all the nations will be assembled before him. And he will separate them one from another, as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats. He will place the sheep on his right and the goats on his left. Then the king will say to those on his right, ‘Come, you who are blessed by my Father. Inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world. For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink, a stranger and you welcomed me, naked and you clothed me, ill and you cared for me, in prison and you visited me.’ Then the righteous will answer him and say, ‘Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you drink? When did we see you a stranger and welcome you, or naked and clothe you? When did we see you ill or in prison, and visit you? And the king will say to them in reply, ‘Amen, I say to you, whatever you did for one of the least brothers of mine, you did for me.’ Then he will say to those on his left, ‘Depart from me, you accursed, into the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels. For I was hungry and you gave me no food, I was thirsty and you gave me no drink, a stranger and you gave me no welcome, naked and you gave me no clothing, ill and in prison, and you did not care for me.’ Then they will answer and say, ‘Lord, when did we see you hungry or thirsty or a stranger or naked or ill or in prison, and not minister to your needs?’ He will answer them, ‘Amen, I say to you, what you did not do for one of these least ones, you did not do for me.’ And these will go off to eternal punishment, but the righteous to eternal life.”

Pastor's Notes

Thanksgiving is always the fourth Thursday in November. According to the New Advent website, this civil holiday is observed annually in the USA as one of national thanksgiving and prayer. It seems that this custom originated in 1621 when Governor Bradford of the Plymouth Colony appointed a day for public praise and prayer after the first harvest. The first national observance was when President Washington recommended that Thursday, November 26th, 1789 be a day of public thanksgiving and prayer.

Many people do not know that the Spanish explorers, who were Catholic, celebrated a Thanksgiving Mass and feast on September 9, 1565 in St. Augustine, Florida with the Timucuan Tribe. Another Thanksgiving feast was held January 26, 1598 near the present day El Paso, Texas. And on April 30, 1598 a Mass of thanksgiving was said. After Mass the Franciscan priests blessed the food on tables laden with fish, ducks, and geese, and over 600 were fed.

This year I will be visiting family for Thanksgiving. There will be Mass November 24th & 25th but there will not be daily Mass at Prince of Peace the rest of the week. St. James will have a 9 am Thanksgiving Day Mass. Please consult their schedule for other opportunities for daily Mass.

On Thanksgiving Day it is good to take time and give thanks to God for all our blessings; so I give thanks for the wonderful people of Prince of Peace. You are a blessing to me. May you have a blessed Thanksgiving day! Here is a prayer for you use from Franciscan media: "We thank you, Father, for the gift of Jesus your Son who came to our earth and lived in a simple home. We have a greater appreciation of the value and dignity of the human family because he loved and was loved within its shelter. Bless us this day; may we grow in love for each other in our family and so give thanks to you who are the maker of all human families and our abiding peace. Amen".
