

Donations to the Food Pantry can be made through the church supplied envelope or make out a check to Prince of Peace Church and mark the envelope "Catholic Community Charities".


Pastoral Visits

First Sunday of Advent will be celebrated December 1st and 2nd. This is when the church begins a new liturgical year. For the year this is likened to a mini-Lent. The first two weeks of Advent call us to remember that life is short. We need to be ready. We need to be alert, for we know not when Christ will come for us.

Advent is our time to recall that on our journey we have not always followed the path of Christ. It is a time that John the Baptist calls us to repentance.

Yet all around us it is looking a lot like Christmas! Advent is the church's season that calls us to slow down, to be attentive, and to look for the coming of the Lord; not at the end of time but here and now.

Advent is our preparation, our journey towards Christmas and for the final coming of Christ. Even though we celebrate this season every year, it is different because we are different.


When we enter the church, we can immediately see a difference. The liturgical colors are now purple. The decorations are simple and focused on the Advent wreath. The four candles correspond to the four Sundays before Christmas. One candle is lit each Sunday until all four burn on the fourth Sunday.

The Advent wreath is made of green branches that symbolize life and hope. The candles remind us of the light of Christ. We are on a journey, a pilgrimage that is on-going. The goal of our journey is to be in paradise. Advent helps us on our journey towards remembering when the light, Jesus, came into the world. It also helps us prepare for his coming again. Here is a web site to help your family with the tradition of making an Advent wreath and praying together nightly until Christmas (<http://www.catholicculture.org/culture/liturgicalyear/prayers/view.cfm?id=16>).

Another tradition that I enjoyed as child was the opening of the Advent Calendar. If you purchase them they are usually a Christmas scene with the dates of the month hidden in the picture. When the date is found, for example the 1st of December, one opens it up and discovers a scripture passage. More expensive ones have the passage and a piece of chocolate. You may purchase them at most stores that sell greeting cards. 
The last two weeks of Advent we focus more on the Christmas story. We remember Holy Mary responding to the Angels invitation to be the Mother of our Lord, Jesus. We remember the journey to Bethlehem, the city of Jesus' birth in a stable. We remember this Holy Family who strived to do God's will.

I invite you to embrace this time of Advent, this time of preparation. When Christmas arrives, celebrate it not only that day, but also try to keep Christmas, the twelve days of Christmas. The Christmas season concludes with the celebration of the Baptism of Jesus.





HOPEFUL EXPECTATION

Our liturgical year begins with the season of Advent—a time of hopeful expectation of the coming of the Lord. On the First Sunday of Advent we look forward to the end of time when we will awaken to the dawn of Christ's new day.

Today we hear Isaiah speak of a day when God's power will have brought universal peace and God's Word will have instructed all people, radiating God's "light" (teachings) into all of human society. Only when humanity walks "in the light of the LORD" (Isaiah 2:5), when all people desire to be instructed "in [God's] ways" (Isaiah 2:3), will the world be set aright and our deepest longings fulfilled. The reading from Romans calls us to "awake from sleep" for this final "day is at hand" (Romans 13:11, 12). Together this Sunday's scriptures proclaim our Christian faith that Jesus is the One who will finally come to fulfill God's plan of salvation.
