



Boat Ramp Rules:

- The ramp fee is \$5 per day per launched vessel.
- Take an envelope from inside the top of the payment box.
- Keep one side of the colored ticket.
 - a. You will need the ticket when you pull your vessel out of the water.
 - i. Vessel = any type of watercraft – boat, pontoon, jet ski, kayak, etc.
- Put your launch fee in the envelope and place in slot on the inside of the payment box.
- If there is no T-Roy's Landing employee visible when you pull your vessel out, drop your side of the ticket in the box. The payment box camera will serve as notification to management with a phone alert.
- Tickets are **NOT Reusable** – Valid for **One** Day.
- No long-term parking – day of use parking only. Park in the grass in front of the house. Pull forward in the grass facing the road. Stack and pack vehicles to allow for more parking. We are not an extended stay parking area as neatness and appearance are of top priority.
- Tickets are valid for **One** vessel; you must pay for **each** vessel launched.
- Boat ramp is monitored by numerous HD video surveillance cameras with microphones and are monitored by management mobile devices real-time. Vehicle license plates will be used to determine those that fail to pay. Necessary action will be taken to address those individuals that fail to pay.
- Please do not trespass in the campground. If you can't backup at the boat ramp do not pull forward and circle the campground. That is trespassing and the cameras and license plate readers will be triggered.
- There is no loitering in the parking lot. Load and unload your boats in a timely fashion. The boat ramp is not to be used for repairs or other items in which prolong launching your boat or others.
- Pets must be leashed at all times. No high-risk breeds allowed. You must clean up after your pet.
- If you have guests joining you in a separate vehicle, they must park in front of the old store building. Guest Parking is \$5.
- Vehicles are subject to be towed at the owner's expense if **ALL** signs and posted rules are not adhered to.
