PINE-STRAWBERRY FIRE BOARD REGULAR MEETING MINUTES May 15, 2025

The meeting was called to order at 2:00 pm.

- 1) Pledge of Allegiance
- 2) Roll Call Present were Members Bob Bennett, Board Chairman Chuck Ackerman, Member Dave Burkhart, and Member Melvin Palmer. Board Clerk Bob Papke was absent.
- 3) **Presentations** Pinning Ceremony for Engineer John Lewin who was pinned by Cathy Smith. Congratulations, John!
- 4) **Correspondence** One letter of thanks was read.
- 5) Call to the Public –

Woody Phillips - The Pine-Strawberry Neighborhood Radio Watch has installed the repeater and would like to thank the firefighters (Chris Williamson, Dan Green, and Kaleb Turner) who helped get this done.

Elsa Steffanson – Pine Strawberry Fuels Reduction wished to invite people to the event that APS will be putting on this Saturday, May 17th at 2:00 to discuss their plans for Emergency Shut-offs.

Janelle Gossling — wished to address the Board regarding a recent traffic accident that occurred on highway 87 and how the traffic was handled. Chief Brandt briefly explained that a by-stander was directing traffic without authority to do so — thereby causing the additional problem.

(Board Member Dave Burkhart reminded the public that the Board is not able to comment on/discuss issues that are not listed on the agenda but that we are happy to put any item on the agenda if it is brought to the Board's attention prior to a Board meeting.)

6) Approval of Previous Minutes

- a) April 15, 2025 Regular Meeting Minutes Dave Burkhart made a motion to accept the minutes as written. Mel Palmer seconded the motion, and it passed unanimously.
- b) May 1, 2025 Special Meeting Minutes Dave Burkhart made a motion to accept the minutes as written. Bob Bennett seconded the motion, and it passed unanimously.

- 7) Financial Report of April 2025 Ben Archer-Clowes of the James Vincent Group was in attendance and presented the financials for April. Dave Burkhart made a motion to approve the financial report as given and to authorize the Board Clerk to sign. Mel Palmer seconded the motion, and it passed unanimously. Training Report – Total training hours completed this month were 502 hours.

The Fire Marshal's Report – The Fire Marshal's office reviewed 2 sets of plans, adding 360 square feet of construction, and totaling \$30.00 of revenue.

Vehicle Report – 2 District vehicles were serviced this month for a total of \$3,729.17. All District vehicles are currently in service.

- 9) Other Fire District Related Reports
 - a) District Board Chairman's Report None.
 - b) Public Safety Personnel Retirement System Local Board Report The PSPRS Local Board met the on 4/29/25 for our newest member, Michael Tweet, who is a transfer from Scottsdale Fire Department.
 - c) Firefighter's Association Report Dan Green reported that the FFA has all the items ready that they are planning to sell at the Memorial Day Craft Fair as well as the other events that will be happening in town this summer. He also stated that the Summer Bash Open House at Station 41 was a great success especially the Dunk Tank!
 - d) Labor Organization Report None.

10) Old Business –

a) Discussion and update on Bond Issuance – Chief Brandt reported that the Resolution has been filed with Gila County and that the lawyers are working on the notifications that will have to be put out in September.

Elsa Steffanson reported that the PAC (Political Action Committee) has an E.I.N. filed with the County and is working with Chase Bank to get an account set up – however, it cannot be done at the branch in Payson. Many donations were already received at the recent Summer Bash Open House on May 4th. She also reported that there have been notices put out on social media, as well as at the Summer Bash Open House, and ALL of the responses have been very positive.

Dominic Masse' reported that the committee doing the plans has met a few times and has a preliminary drawing made for the layout of the new Station/Administration offices. They are now working on the floor plan and elevations.

No action taken.

- **b) Update/Discussion on investment options** Chief Brandt reported that there is nothing new to report at this time.
- c) Discussion/Possible action on 2025/2026 Budget Ben Archer-Clowes reviewed the budget that was presented to the Board last month. He stated that we are sticking with the current 3.5 tax rate, we are proposing a 1-step increase for those who qualify and a 2.5 % COLA (Cost of Living Adjustment) which follows the social security COLA. The Medic stipend has increased to \$2.88/hour. He also stated that the budget is built around planning for 6-man staffing starting in May (as usual). However, as of 2025, we plan on running that 6-man position year-round in an effort to cut down on overtime costs.

Dave Burkhart made a motion to tentatively adopt the 2025/2026 budget with the 3.5 tax rate. Chuck Ackerman seconded the motion, and it passed unanimously. (Budget will be posted for 20 days prior to adoption.)

11) New Business –

(Items to be considered, reviewed, discussed, and possible action on)

a) Discussion/action/adoption of reviewed policies.

Policy 3.6 Complaints & Investigations – Dave Burkhart stated that this policy has been sent to the lawyer for review and there were minor changes made in terminology and spelling. Dave Burkhart made a motion to adopt the revised Policy 3.6 with an effective date of May 30, 2025. Mel Palmer seconded the motion, and it passed unanimously.

Policy 4.13 Medical, Dental, & Vision Insurance – Dave Burkhart explained that minor changes were made to this policy, including the option of utilizing any or all of the policies. There is also an option to opt out of the insurance coverage and still receive the HSA deposit as long as the employee is covered by a high-deductible health plan. Dave Burkhart made a motion to approve and adopt Policy 4.13 as presented and revised with an effective date of May 30, 2025. Bob Bennett seconded the motion, and it passed unanimously.

12) **Future Board Meeting Date** – Due to the Federal Holiday that falls on the third Thursday of June (Juneteenth), the Board meeting will be held on Tuesday, June 17, 2025, at 3:00 pm.

13) **Adjournment:** Dave Burkhart made a motion to adjourn. Chuck Ackerman seconded the motion, and it passed unanimously at 3:35 pm.

However, it's become increasingly critical for "The Rest of Us," our families, our friends, and our community, to also have access to reliable communications when cell phone and Internet services fail. Getting a Ham Radio license requires passing a test beyond the interests of most. But there are radio alternatives that people can use without having to pass a test. Pine/Strawberry residents can learn how to use simple & affordable GMRS radios to communicate when phone and Internet services are disabled. An FCC GMRS license is like buying a fishing license. Simply pay \$35 for a 10-year license that covers your whole family and get a call sign to use on the air.

General Mobile Radio Service - GMRS


GMRS Radios are affordable, FM transceivers that allow you to communicate with your family and neighbors when cell phones and other means of communication are not available. Pine Strawberry Neighborhood Watch conducts a weekly Net to allow us to test and learn to use our radios so we are ready should we need them. There is no cost to join other than the cost of a GMRS license and an affordable radio. If you are interested in getting On-The-Air, but don't know where to start, join our Email List, or contact Woody Phillips directly by emailing KJ7YYI@ARRL.net

GMRS hand held radios (NOT FRS blister pack radios sold at Walmart) cost as little as \$25 and are "Repeater Capable" meaning you communicate over much longer distances. Mobile Radios can get pricey but offer more flexibility including the ability to set-up a base station at home or office. Our members can help you decide what will work best for your needs.

Neighborhood Radio Watch Programs ARE NOT a replacement for Emergency Services such as Police, Fire, the Sheriff's Office or 911. These programs are intended solely as a backup communications solution When All Else Fails.

Last month there were 65 calls for service.

Vehicle Report – 2 District vehicles had service done this month. The new brush truck had tires replaced, bed mounted, and the slip unit installed. A-43 had new tires installed. \$3,729.17 was spent on vehicle maintenance this month, and all District vehicles are in service.

Training Report - Total training hours completed this month were 502 hours reported for all career members, and 69 hours reported for reserve members.

Plan Reviews – The PSFD Fire Marshall reviewed 2 sets of plans this month with a total addition of 360 SQ FT. The total fees collected this month were a total of \$30.00.

Significant Incidents and Events:

- Work has begun on the DFFM 70/30 Fuels Reduction Grant. This grant was submitted in June for \$668,000.
- We have ordered all the necessary parts for the new brush truck and plan to have it ready for the upcoming fire season.
- Our new member Mike Tweet has started, and all of our positions are fully staffed.
