

COMPACT

Human-scaled, affordable, walkable, mixed-use environments.



CONNECTED

Seamless, multimodal networks for people, not just cars.



CLIMATE-FORWARD


Resilient, green infrastructure that supports low-carbon mobility.



Embedding 3C into the Foundations of Urban Planning

Design community plans grounded in the 3C Framework

Build sidewalk networks and implement green street design standards



Advance mixed-use zoning, form-based codes, and green infrastructure incentives

Track access safety, equity, and emissions with a 3C metrics dashboard

Shape planning goals by embedding the 3C Framework in the community visioning & needs assessment

Why Does This Framework Matter?



Focuses on streets, not form-based codes




Ensures planners, engineers, and the public are on the same page



Promotes walkability through a coherent, replicable process

Walkability and Coherence in Practice


Leveraging public-private partnerships and robust community engagement is the key to implementing these CNU tenets.




The 3C Framework in Three Settings







The Challenge



Transform Fifth Avenue between Bryant Park and Central Park into an innovative, pedestrian-focused space for the public to enjoy.

The Approach



We convened a complex network of public and private partners, facilitating community-wide meetings and administering large-scale surveys.

The Interventions



We paved the way for a series of improvements to Fifth Avenue, including expanded sidewalks and inviting streetscape infrastructure.

The Challenge

Address increased mobility, walkability, and transportation concerns caused by a significant population influx.



The Approach

We adopted an intimate and up-close approach, facilitating targeted surveys and leading community-wide meetings with local residents from all walks of life.



The Interventions

Our community-first approach led us to the following recommendations

- Position Hudson as a recognized leader in walkability and mobility
- Improve local mobility and regional access
- Create unique "Hudson" wayfinding throughout he city



The Challenge



Reimagine traffic safety infrastructure in light of crashes caused by vehicle, pedestrian, and bicycle congestion.

The Approach



In collaboration with both municipalities, we are developing a Comprehensive Safety Action Plan that will take steps to prevent serious injury and death.

The Interventions



We are currently identifying locations with the greatest opportunity to reduce severe crashes, promoting proven safety measures such as those put forth in the National Roadway Safety Strategy.


