



We've Secured the Soil. Now Let's Grow the Future.



For more than 20 years, Friends of Holly Hill Farm has cultivated not just crops, but curiosity, connection, and community on these 5.23 beautiful acres of land, generously leased to us by the White family.

In 2026, thanks to the incredible generosity of our *Keep Our Farm a Farm* campaign supporters, we reached a milestone that once felt like a dream: we raised the funds needed to purchase the land that is Holly Hill Farm. In September 2026, the purchase was finalized, and the land has been protected—forever.

But Holly Hill Farm is more than the land. It's the people who gather here to learn, grow, and reconnect with the land. Now it's time to give them the space and tools they need to thrive.

With your continued support, we will improve and expand the farm's core infrastructure: making critical improvements to our historic 1785 barn that is home to our year-round farm stand so that everyone can access the building and our farmers can protect our harvests from frigid winter weather; improving traffic flow and parking; and creating a year-round indoor educational space with heat, a working kitchen for teaching and preparing food for food pantries, and real restrooms.

Like the purchase of Sandy Beach a century ago, this is a once-in-a-generation opportunity — to secure a community treasure **and invest in its future.**

We've come so far. Let's finish what we started — and ensure Holly Hill Farm continues to grow and inspire for generations to come.

Renovate Main Barn

Update and improve our Main Barn that supports our farm stand operations and make the farm more accessible to everyone.

Build a New Education Space

Build new multi-purpose programming space to support year-round educational programs and community events, including heat, a working kitchen and restrooms.

Improve Traffic Flow and Parking



We've secured the soil.

Holly Hill Farm's roots run deep! The land has been farmed continuously since the early 1600s and prior to that time by Massachusog and Wampanoag Peoples. Since 2002, our non-profit has farmed and taught on this historic land, leased with love and generosity from the White family, whose stewardship of this land stretches back to the mid-1800s. **In September 2026, thanks to the incredible generosity of supporters, our nonprofit purchased the land (Step 1)!** We now own and will continue to operate the farm. A Conservation Restriction has been placed on the portion of the land that was not previously protected and will be held jointly by the Wildlands Trust and the Town of Cohasset. This means the land will be permanently protected from future development.

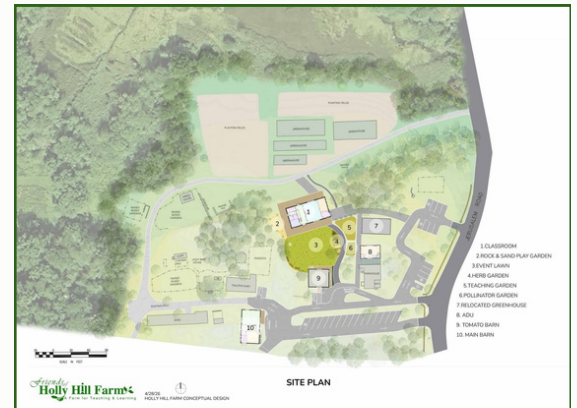
Now let's grow the future.

The infrastructure that served us over twenty years ago is the same one we rely upon today.

Our main barn is over 240 years old and sustains our year-round farm stand operations.

Updates and renovations will:

- Improve shopping experience
- Introduce climate control to protect our harvests from frigid winter temperatures
- Create an accessible entrance so everyone can easily shop



Currently, we do not have an indoor programming space to host educational programs, field trips, or fundraising events during rainy weather and cold winters.

Improvements will

- Create a sustainably built year-round indoor learning space with heat, a working kitchen for teaching and preparing food for local food pantries, and real restrooms.

In addition to the enhancements listed above, we will improve parking and traffic on the farm.
