The Delaware Youth Center's long-standing grandstand has been removed, thanks to a generous community donation that fully funds the demolition. While the structure holds decades of memories, sadly it has become unsafe and beyond repair, with rotting beams and instability making it a Over the years, the Board explored many options—from renovation to storage solutions—but each proved too costly or impractical. Removing the deteriorated structure will open up valuable space for families to enjoy.

Although saying farewell is bittersweet, the Youth Center plans to honor the grandstand's history as part of future improvements, including new backstop fencing and upgraded, safe seating. Not to worry, youth sports and community activities will continue uninterrupted.

Can you tell us a little about yourself and how you got involved in DYC?

Some of my earliest and fondest memories are tied to the Delaware Youth Center. As young girls, my sister and I would ride our bikes down the hill from our family farm in the Beechwoods, lunches packed and ready for a full

day at the Center. We spent our mornings in swimming

lessons and our afternoons on the playground, learning everything from the high-jump to the putt throw under the guidance of kind and encouraging staff.

In 2015, I was invited to join a new initiative designed to bring more activity to the Center. That group became Delaware Young @ Heart. I began by co-chairing games and helping to launch weekly mah-jongg sessions, which—almost ten years later—are still going strong. After a pause in activities due to health issues within the group, Barbara Long and I decided to revive the program. She took on organizing trips, I handled the business meetings, and with board support, Delaware Young @ Heart is once again thriving.

What is your favorite DYC memory?

As an adult, it was especially meaningful to return to the Center with my own children and watch them enjoy the same pool and playground I grew up with. Over the years, my involvement deepened—from hosting our Knack family reunions at the pavilion to taking on officer roles and volunteering wherever I could.

Along the way, I've also sold raffle tickets for the River Run. I learned that when you greet people with a smile and mention the Youth Center, the tickets practically sell themselves. This community holds the Center in such high regard, and that has made my involvement both easy and deeply rewarding.

What is your vision for the Center?

I believe the Delaware Youth Center has always been a cornerstone of our community, and I see that continuing well into the future. My vision is one in which the Center remains a place where people of all ages feel welcome, supported, and engaged—whether through recreation, social programs, or community events.

The activities offered today already show how strong the Center's impact is, and I hope to see even more opportunities for connection, enrichment, and intergenerational involvement.
