While each presentation was impressive, hearing from Jacee Beth was particularly impactful. For those unfamiliar with her story, at just 17 years old, Jacee Beth Thomas experienced a life-changing moment.

while taking a break from working in the fields with her family in Hoboken, Georgia, Jacee was on her way to get lunch when her car collided with an oncoming train at the railroad tracks near her home. Her Honda Accord was dragged for 1,700 feet before the train finally came to a halt. She was immediately airlifted to Jacksonville, Florida, and later transferred to the Shepherd Center in Atlanta, Georgia. As a result of the accident, she sustained a broken collarbone, minor cuts, and severe brain trauma, which left her with a traumatic brain injury (TBI). I wanted to share this in my president's message to convey Jacee's important message to our chapter: SLOW DOWN.

I hope that by sharing this, you feel inspired to become more involved with our chapter. There is a place for everyone to contribute, and taking the next step your membership valuable lead to can networking opportunities with industry professionals. I can personally attest that I have gained lifelong friendships through Region Six.



FALL FORUM RECAP

Ghost Tours, Hurricanes, Speeches, OH MY!



After 11 months of hard work, countless meetings, and hours of planning, Chapter 22 hosted the Region 6 Fall Forum in Savannah, GA. During October 7th through October 9th, our Chapter's board put on a class, symposium and forum that had everyone buzzing. Even with the threat of impending Hurricane Milton, we saw an incredible turnout of almost 60 members from across the region. The mossy trees surrounding historic downtown, set the scene for our evenings on the town.

Chapter 22's own Clyde Johnson led class 213 Monday morning, Conflict on Management. This in-person training allowed for creative dialogue, collective brainstorming, role-playing scenarios, and group activities. The art of managing conflict is understanding that while conflict is a common place occurrence, it cannot be avoided and should be faced head on.

Monday night's welcome dinner was hosted by Chapter 22's Young Professionals. The event was held at Poe's Tavern just across the street from the hotel. Lauren McKenzie from the Marietta based law firm Bentley, Bentley and Bentley. McKenzie is an "Of Counsel" attorney with diverse civil litigation experience including eminent domain, real estate, and complex commercial litigation cases. The topic up for discussion was how to avoid pitfalls with eminent domain. Lauren covered the most common missteps a Right-of-Way agent can make during acquisition which could lead to delays should negotiations end with legal action.









Following Lauren was Matthew Alexander with Rochester & Associate, LLC where he serves as Senior Project Manager. With over two decades of experience in surveying, Matt was well-versed in the pros and cons that come with technology such as GIS. While a handy tool for a quick glance, GIS is not the most accurate source of information so at the end of the day your best bet is to always... Get It Surveyed!

Just before lunch, we had the incredible opportunity to listen to the inspirational story of Jacee Beth Thomas, a young woman whose life was changed in an instant. On May 24, 2016, Jacee was struck by an oncoming train and was dragged for near 1,700 feet before the train was able to come to a stop. She was taking a break to grab lunch from working in the fields with her family down in Hoboken, GA. The accident occurred at a private crossing near the family's fields, where there were no crossing gates, lights or sounds present. She was immediately life-lighted to Jacksonville, Florida and later to the Shepherd Center in Atlanta, Georgia. As a result, she suffered from a broken collarbone, a few tiny cuts and a Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI) as a result of shearing her brain at the stem. Jacee spoke with us about her desire to continue to live life to the fullest and her lifelong goal to compete on the world stage as a competitive team roper.

Following a delicious lunch at the hotel, we heard from Anthony and Jon from CSX, who spoke about permitting and their real estate ventures. They also briefly discussed

... private crossings and how tragic incidents like what happened to Jaycee Beth could happen. Then we heard Trinia Morris who serves as a program manager and wildlife biologist with the Wildlife Conservation Section (WCS) of the Georgia Department of Natural Resources (GA DNR). Trinia enlightened the group on the ecological importance of Bats.

Former Georgia Department of Transportation (GDOT) Eric Murray, spoke next about why a Review Appraiser is a friend rather than adversary. Murray has over 36 years of right of way acquisition, appraisal services and appraisal review. Leading us into the late afternoon was Marshall Wainright from the Federal Highway Administration. The topic at the forefront was Relocation Planning and Assistance. Wainright has roughly 25 years' experience in government realty/right of way acquisition. Finally wrapping up our day of speakers, was Jamie McCurry from the Georgia Ports Authority. Jamie oversees contracts, properties & planning, purchasing, governmental affairs and many other things for the Authority. McCurry spoke about the growth of the Savannah port as a major player on the global stage for imports and exports.

How to Save a Life! CPR 101

Safety is the most important priority in our right of way industry, especially for those who work in the field. For this reason, our guest speakers, EMS first responders from Grady Hospital, were asked to provide and demonstrate life saving tips in critical situations. They displayed the new CPR protocol which now does not include mouth to mouth resuscitation due to concern over communicable diseases. Additionally, when you or someone else, has an injury with an active bleed, remember to use a tourniquet to help stop the bleeding. The saying "High and Tight" is best practice in this case. Avoid joints when applying the tourniquet and write the time it was placed on the individual. Do not remove a tourniquet once placed otherwise instructed unless physician.







