# Registered Voters in NC

As of April 11, 2026, in NC there were 7,741,397 voters.

In Moore County there were:

33,650 Republicans

31,900 Unaffiliated and

14,683 Registered Democrats- for a total of 80,861 registered voters!

To win elections in Moore County, Dems need to make sure all of our “like-minded” neighbors and friends are registered to vote in November.

# Early Voting in Moore County

Dates and locations are decided by the MCBOE.

Power over the BOE has changed from the Democrat Governor to the Republican Auditor, resulting in a minority of Democrats on each county BOE.

Moore County Commissioners recently passed a Resolution and sent it to the NCSBE to reduce Early Voting days from 17 down to 7!

Call to Action: speak out at BOE meetings when Early Voting dates are chosen. Write letters of opposition to the County Commissioners.

# Make a Plan to Vote

Register to Vote. It's simple.

Check your Registration. It's easy!

Have acceptable Photo Identification.

# Vote Early!

Fix common voting issues (Curable) by registering to vote or updating your registration (Registration Repair) prior to or during Early Voting.

Multiple Early Voting Sites and 17 days to vote early will minimize the long lines and wait times to vote in Moore County.

## CALL TO ACTION:

Attend Moore County Board of Elections meetings to follow Early Voting days and locations. Speak publically to support policies that are important to you and your neighbors!.

Voters must be US  
Citizens.

North Carolina requires  
photo identification to cast  
a ballot.

Don't have a current NC Driver's License, passport or approved student or government/ military ID?

# Planning to Vote by Mail in 2026?

## ***Common problems and how to avoid them-***

**Problem:** Missing Witness Information

**Solution:** Include full address, printed name and signatures for 2 witnesses or have a notary witness your ballot. MCDP Notary.

**Problem:** Missing voter signature.

**Solution:** Voter signs the ballot return envelope.

**Problem:** Missing photo ID

**Solution:** Include a photocopy of your photo ID or include a photo ID exception form. Copies can be made at the MCDP office.

**Problem:** Voted ballot arrives late to CBOE office.

**Solution:** Mail the ballot as soon as possible- at least by October 20th. It must arrive by 7:30 pm on Election Day (Nov. 3, 2026), not just be postmarked thanks to our Republican legislature. You can hand deliver your ballot to the Board of Elections office or an Early Voting location. You can track your mail in ballot. If it has not been received by Election Day, you can vote in person instead.
