

MAGI SOCCER WINS WDA REGULAR SEASON CROWN

For the 7th time Minot High Boys Soccer reigns supreme in the WDA. The Magi defeated Legacy (1-0) at Duane Carlson Stadium last Thursday evening to clinch Back-to-Back West Region Titles. Goaltending was the key for both sides in this Championship Showdown. Nate Olheiser of Legacy made 10 saves, while Minot High's JJ Dufner stopped all 20, picking up his 8th shutout of the season. The lone goal of the match came in the 52nd minute when Minot point leader Brayden Oswalt picked up his WDA best 20th point of the season on a penalty kick. The rain fell from the sky for most of this tug of war all the way to the final buzzer. Minot and Legacy both clinched spots in the State Tournament and will meet again in the WDA Tournament Finals to decide the West Regions #1 Seed for the State Tournament. Legacy finished the regular season at (12-3) overall and (11-3) in the West. Minot improved to (13-2-1) overall and (11-2-1) in the West.
