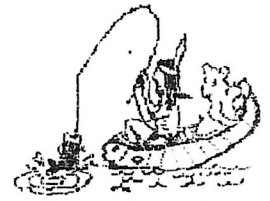

Board Highlights

July: Noted that no meeting was held in June due to several members being away and a quorum not available. Accepted resignation of Mrs. Bland due to illness in her family with regret and thanks for service on the Board. Received report that the pool opened as scheduled and that volley ball equipment is available for checkout. Teens are selling soft drinks at poolside to finance their activities. Reviewed plans for pier construction adjacent to F-Section boat ramp and voted to advise CAMA that Association had no objection.

August: Reviewed status of revision of P-Section covenants, and input given at two meetings held with lot owners. Heard additional input from P-Section lot owners present at Board meeting. Noted that nominations for election to Board and any proposed revisions to Bylaws are needed in a timely manner for publication for the Annual Meeting which is to be held November 13th.

MEMBERSHIP MEETING

The annual meeting of the membership of the Association will be on Saturday, November 13. As provided in the bylaws the membership is to elect governors to fill the terms expiring on December 31. This year the terms of three members of the Board expire and there is another vacancy due to a resignation. Our community needs board members who are willing to work. Written nominations must be received not later than 45 days before the meeting, September 28.

Other matters which are likely to be discussed and voted on at the annual meeting are changes to bylaws. The bylaws committee studying changes in special assessment levels for owners whose septic systems extend over three or more lots and a reduction of assessments for P-Section owners who install private electric meters.

For P-Section Owners

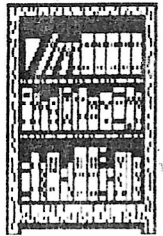
The Health Department has, after discussions with the Attorney Generals office, decided that they have no objection to P-Section owners having private electric meters installed.

Space is still available for interested participants. For more information, call 919 - 426 - 7697.



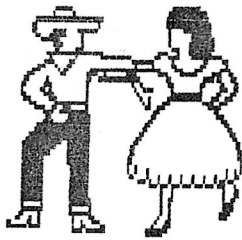
Ladies

Youth Activities



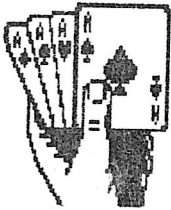

Crime Watch and Disaster Program



As frequently happens during the Summer, petty thievery and vandalism have increased in the community - remember to lock things up carefully, keep areas well lighted and watch your neighborhood for unfamiliar people, cars or activities.

The Police are aware of the problem and will respond as quickly as they can to your call. Some very good action happened recently because neighbors in Snug Harbor were watching out for empty properties and a home where residents were temporarily gone. Neighbors helping neighbors really does work.

At our July meeting Mr. Todd Tilley, Perquimans County Disaster Coordinator, spoke to our residents. He introduced Mr. Doug Hoell of the NC Emergency Team (Division of Emergency management) from Raleigh. Betty Lake took notes which we share with you:

In 1984-85 the Division of Emergency Management studied low lying areas (clubhouse is 10.5 ft above sea level) taking into account the number of people and how long it would take to evacuate them. Goals are to inform residents and then evacuate them out of the area before wind gales reach the area from a hurricane. Ocracoke would be the first to be evacuated - at least 24 hrs before winds hit the area.

The Red Cross and Emergency Management teams open shelters inland first. As the storm nears, shelters closer to the coast will open to take care of people stuck on the roads....

• Special population — elderly, medically needy and infirmed should go to shelters inland early as some are set up especially for their needs....

• Locally there are 3 shelters:

1. Perquimans County High School (Hertford)
2. Hertford Grammar School
3. Snug Harbor Clubhouse

• The County Chairman (presently Mr. Leo Higgins) makes the decision if a county is to be evacuated.

• Most people usually go to families, friends or motels, but if you go to a shelter, bring with you blankets, pillows, food, water, medicines, flashlight and something to pass the time such as a book, radio or tapes ..etc. **Do not bring pets**, they are better off loose to find their own shelter and usually do quite well at staying alive.

In a disaster, the Red Cross and Salvation Army are usually the first on the scene.

- Red Cross = food station, medicines, etc.
- Salvation Army = food stations
- Churches = distribution centers for food, personnel, building materials, etc.
- Military = help with feeding, temporary housing, prevent looting, sand bagging, etc.

This year it is predicted 11 named storms and 2 three-stage or better hurricanes will occur (not necessarily on the east coast - could be anywhere) Evaluate your personal insurance and be certain it meets your needs.

We continue to meet at the clubhouse on the 2nd Tuesday of every month at 7:30 p.m. All residents are invited — Come and bring a friend/neighbor.

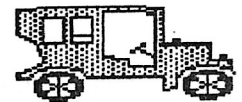


Perquimans County Indian Summer Festival
