

Our assessment collection at the end of February is 10% above last years. We are not at 100%, but we are trying very hard to collect what is owed to us.



Ditches and Culverts

Several Snug Harbor residents have asked about cleaning the ditches in front of their property. In addition, ditches that are overgrown prevent the flow of storm water and provide excellent breeding grounds for mosquitoes and other undesirable insects. As we move into the spring and summer this will become more critical. In cases involving ditches along state owned streets, you can call The County Manager's office or Mr. Swain at the Perquimans County DOT office to complain. On community owned roads we are making every effort to ensure that they remain cut and clean. We ask that whether it is a state owned road or ours, if the ditch abuts your property, you can help all of Snug Harbor by maintaining those ditches free of debris and keeping them cut to increase water flow.

HURRICANE SEASON IS COMING!!

Are you prepared for the upcoming hurricane season? As we move into this season, the Board is dedicated to getting as much information out as soon as possible. We will e-mail all information received from the County to all those that we have e-mail addresses for. We ask that you register on the SHPOA website to facilitate this effort. Should you need transportation or special needs, we ask that you look into what assistance is available now! We ask that all of our residents look at their Hurricane Preparedness Plan now and make sure that you have the following:

- Evacuation Plan: Make sure you notify relatives outside the area where you are going! Do not wait until the last minute to leave if you are evacuating, or if they issue a mandatory evacuation order.
- Food and Water: The National Hurricane Center recommends a minimum of Seven (7) days worth of food and water be on hand for each family member residing with you. (DON'T FORGET THE SAME FOR YOUR PETS!!) Remember to fill things such as your bathtubs and all water containers for flushing water!!
- Gas and Oil: If you are staying and you have a generator, stock up on gas and oil!! Remember that even though the local gas stations try and get back online as soon as possible, they too may be without power longer than expected.
- Medicine: You should refill all prescriptions early enough to ensure that you are covered. The Family Care Pharmacy in Hertford recommends you to:
 - o Try to get your medicine two days before projected landfall.
 - o Bring in your bottles! If there is no power that is the only way a pharmacy can refill your medicine.
- Shelters: We remind everyone that the clubhouse is not an authorized shelter and will not be opened during the storm. The clubhouse will reopen after the storm passes to provide what services we can and act as a central point for getting help to those that need it!!
- Individuals that have chain saws, heavy equipment and generators: We ask that you notify us in advance if you are willing to help in the recovery of our community! Please call Steve at 426-5823 to let him know if we can count on you.

- 4. Have a highly visible house number


