Board Highlights

May: Approved a request from Snug Harbor Community Church to place new signs. The last dance was reported to be attended by 60 persons and cleared \$127 toward tennis court repair. A letter was approved to be sent to the County Commissioners in support of an ordinance for "Junk Cars". Correspondence was reviewed in regard to P-Section electrical power.

Summer Reminder: Trash Disposal

The dumpsters are gone from Snug Harbor and all of the County. The nearest disposal/recycling site is behind Allen's Service Station, on the west side of Rt. 17, 1/2 mile north of Snug Harbor Road. The site is open 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Friday and Saţurday; Sunday 1 p.m. to 6 p.m.; closed Thursdays. For those traveling North on 17, there is a county site about half-way to Elizabeth City on the right hand side, (about 1 mile from county line).

P-Section Covenants:

A draft of revised covenants for the camping section will be available for lot owners inspection in July. For the revision to become effective it is necessary that for owners of the majority of the lots in P-Section give their approval. Your comments and suggestions are needed so that the revised covenants meet the desires of the lot owners. The objective is to maintain the section as a clean, safe and affordable camping rea for owners and their families. Copies of the revised covenants are expected to be available for review beginning in mid-July. P-Section lot owners who want to discuss the covenants or to offer suggestions for further changes are invited to be at the clubhouse on Saturday July 17th or July 24th between 10:30 a.m. and 1:00 p.m. Written comments can be mailed to S.H.P.O.A., PO Box 392, Hertford, NC 27944.
