


In May, the Civic League and Albemarle Plantation volunteers helped raise over \$14,000 at their Tag Sale for Perquimans Emergency Medical Service.

Architectural Committee

Correction to Aesthetics/Architectural Rules and Regulations Policy 02-A-02
Last quarter SHPOA published an update to this policy. Since then we have talked with the county building inspector and learned that all construction requires a building permit with no minimum size exception. To bring SHPOA in compliance with the county, your SHPOA Board approved a change to paragraph c. to read "A building permit must be obtained from the Perquimans County Building Inspector for all structure Approval of the Architectural Committee is required before the County Building Permit may be obtained.

Water Park News



Attention Parents!!! For the safety of your young children please don't let them go to the park unsupervised. To access the park you must carry your SHPOA membership card or be wearing a pool pass tag. You can help SHPOA by remembering the old boy scout camp slogan "Always leave an area in better condition then you found it". So please use the trash cans, clean up any mess you or your children might make in the bathrooms, and if you see any trash laying around help us all out by picking it up and throwing it away. It saves your association time and money and keeps our park looking great. Thanks. We want every property owner and their guests to enjoy the park and ask that you please comply with the park rules.

- 1. Hours of use are from dawn until dark. This rule applies to the park and parking area.
- 2. Bikes skateboards, and motorized vehicles are not allowed in the park. There is a bike parking area and we ask that you use it.
- 3. Unleashed dogs, and cats are prohibited. And for

health reasons we'd ask you clean up after your dog. There are a lot of barefoot children in the park.

4. No alcoholic beverages, weapons, profanity, or fireworks are permitted.

With so many youngsters in and around the park we would ask you to drive slowly and watch out for them.

Your board would ask your assistance to help remind other property owners of our park rules. If you see someone who is not a property owner using our park, or anyone vandalizing your park don't hesitate to immediately report this to any board member or Community Watch. The Perquimans Sheriff routinely patrols our park at night and quickly responds to trespassing after hours.

Snug Harbor Property Owners Association

The maintenance person will report directly to the maintenance supervisor who is a member in good standing on the governing board of Snug Harbor Property Owners Association.

Requirements:

- 1. High School Graduate
- 2. Knowledge, Skill, Ability in operating maintenance/heavy equipment. Ie. Tractor and accessories mowing equipment, weed eater.
- 3. Ability to lift 80 pounds
- 4. General Mechanical Ability
- 5. Knowledge, Skill, Ability in operating power tools
- 6. Willingness to engage in training programs—ie Pool Certification
- 7. Valid North Carolina driver's license

Preferred:

- 1. Knowledge, skill, ability in basic electricity
- 2. Knowledge, skill, ability in basic plumbing
- 3. Knowledge, skill, ability in basic carpentry
- 4. Knowledge, skill, ability in swimming pool maintenance
- 5. Ability to order/procure material

The maintenance person shall be responsible for maintaining and improving all SHPOA owned buildings and property. He/she will be a general handyperson with a strong work ethic who can work independently with minimum supervision.

Salary will be commensurate with candidate's background, experience. All candidates will be subjected to a criminal background check and maybe subject to drug testing. Must be 21 or older. Life saving skills preferred. Apply at office or call 426-5172 and leave message.

Bill Ferguson will now be heading up the Community Watch.


