The National Championships is typically held every year with the goal of selecting the top martial arts athletes to represent Canada in International Events and Competition. After a 2 year hiatus as a result of the pandemic, we are excited to bring back the event in the beautiful City of Thunder Bay with the support of both the City and the Provincial Government. The event will involve over 500 participants throughout a 3 day period and will incorporate a Kung Fu Master's Gala Show to kick it off. This year's competition will select National Team athletes for 2022-23 and will pre-qualify additional athletes for 2024 International events. The Wushu competition offers medaling opportunities in male and female categories in different age groups through a select number of Taolu, Sanda (free fighting), Taiji and Traditional Kung Fu events.

During the competition the athletes will showcase Wushu to many who have never seen it before or seen it in person. We hope to intrigue the audiences through the athleticism and abilities of the athletes and display the competition format and different sporting elements of Wushu.

 on the combined score of top individual bare hand routine and top weapon routine.
- Wushu Taolu: Male/Female SENIOR divisions High Performance Level Only
 Optional Routines there with difficulty requirements.

 *TOP 4 MALE AND 4 FEMALE ATHLETES will pre-qualify for the 2022-23 Canadian National Senior
 Wushu Team to participate at the NEXT World Championships. Selection will be based on the
 combined score of top individual bare hand routine and top weapon routine.
- Kung Fu Taolu: Recreational Fees apply only \$75.00
 Bare Hand and Weapons Divisions sub divided by Age and Level selected
 *TOP 5 MALE AND 5 FEMALE ATHLETES in advanced level will pre-qualify for the 2022-23 Canadian National Traditional Wushu Team to participate at the NEXT World Traditional Championships.
 Selection will be based on the combined score of top individual bare hand routine and top weapon routine. Additional spots will be established at a future date in 2023.
- Taiji: Male/Female Recreational and High Performance Levels
 Bare Hand and Weapons Divisions sub divided by Age and bracket selected
 *TOP ATHLETES in High Performance level for each Group bracket (5 positions) will pre-qualify for the 2022-24 Canadian National Taiji Wushu Team to participate at the NEXT World Taijiquan Championships. Additionally, any participant not within the top rank shall receive a bonus of 0.1 for any gold, .075 for silver and .050 for bronze medal achieved which will be added to their overall ranking score at the next qualification. Selection will be based on the combined score of top 2 individual routines. Additional spots will be established at a future date in 2023.



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- Sanda Free Fighting: Male/Female
 - 1) 13-14 years old Class C
 - 2) 15-17 / 18 + years old Class B
 - 3) 18-29 years old Class A
 - * There will be various weight matches allotted based on age/gender bracket
 - * Clubs must submit their athletes for consideration by June 16th, 2022.
 - * Earlier submissions and experience levels will receive priority on qualification placement.
 - * Competition will be held over 7-8 sessions in Round Robin Format.
 - * Maximum 6 athletes per Bracket.

*TOP MALE AND FEMALE ATHLETES will pre-qualify and ranked for the 2022-24 Canadian National Sanda Wushu Team to participate at the NEXT World Junior and Senior Championships. Final selection will be based on the athletes placement in this and additional events to take place in 2023. Winners of this Championships will be provided priority allotment in weight category selection on the respective National Teams.

5. PARTICIPATION ELIGIBILITY

All participating athletes and clubs

- Participants MUST be registered as an Athlete/Coach or Official under WushuCanada.
- Schools/Clubs of competitive athletes must be club members of WushuCanada for recognition.
- Sanda Free Fighting athletes must provide medical requirements and have them uploaded and available on their online profile to be considered.
- Age of participant is as of January 1 of the competition year.
- Weight classes of Sanda athletes are based on ACTUAL intended weight on the day of competition.
 Athletes must weigh in at +/- 2lbs of their indicated weight on application or risk disqualification.
 Weigh in will be held on Check in Day and on first Competition Day.

8. SANDA FREE FIGHTING CATEGORIES:

- Qualifying divisions will be based on the WushuOntario Match system.

Athletes will be matched based on a variance of no more than 10lbs between competitors.

- Combat Class and equipment requirements are based on age bracket.
 - Class C Regulations 12-14 Sanda (Full Face Gear, No Head Kicks, Round Robin/1 min Rds)
 - Class B Regulations 15-17/18 and over (Full Face Gear, No Head Kicks)
 - Class A Regulations 18-39 (Open Face Gear, Full Contact)

9. PLACING AND AWARDS

High Performance Wushu/KungFu and Taiji Events:

- 1. Athletes shall be awarded Gold, Silver or Bronze medals in top 3 placings along with Certificate
- 2. All other athletes will be Awarded Certificates with placing.
- 3. Recreational and Open Events will recieve Gold, Silver or Bronze medals based on score achieved.
- 4. Sanda Combat will be awarded Gold, Silver, and Bronze along with Certificate.
- 5. All other athletes will be Awarded Certificates without placing.
- 6. SANDA QUALIFIERS Sanda National Team Selections will be held for all juniors under 17 years of age. All others will be ranked for 2022-23 National Rankings.

The Canadian National Junior sanda team shall be composed of a maximum eleven (11) competitors (8 boys and 3 girls) separated as follows:

- Junior Sanda Athletes (Maximum 8 athletes) o A maximum of five (5) boys and three (3) girls who were born between January 1, 2005 December 31, 2008.
- Children's Sanda Athletes (Maximum 3 athletes) o A maximum of three (3) boys who were born between January 1, 2008 December 31, 2010.

7. TAIJI COMPETITION

Age Groups: Group A: 14 to 17 years of age

Group B: 18 years of age and above

TAIJI PERFORMANCE (DEMONSTRATION)

Age Groups: Group A: 14 to 17 years of age

Group B: 18 to 39 years of age

Group C: 40 and above



8. The National Ranking Events will be conducted in accordance with the newest edition of the Rules for International Wushu Taolu Competition endorsed by the IWuF. The right of interpretation of the Rules rests solely with WushuCanada's technical chair. Selected participants of the Canadian National Wushu Team must provide a valid life insurance certificate, valid passport, and valid medical certificate including an ECG test.

10. ARBITRATION

WushuOntario will establish an Arbitration Committee for the purpose of resolving any competition disputes. Prior to the completion of the whole competition, the participant or coach must inform the Chief Judge that they wish to file a complaint. A \$100 (non-refundable) fee in cash and a written complaint must be submitted to the Arbitration Committee within one hour commencing the completion of the whole event. Decisions made by the Arbitration Committee will be considered final. If a continued dispute arises refer to the WushuOntario Dispute Resolution Policy.

12. CODE OF CONDUCT

First and foremost, utmost respect amongst all athletes competing against each other. Coaches should lead by example and advise their athletes regardless of the outcome. Participants must always respect themselves, their fellow competitors, coaches and most importantly the judges. The behaviors of the athletes are a direct reflection of the coach and it is the responsibility of the coach to ensure that athletes conduct themselves in a responsible and respectful manner to all bodies within the competition. If a coach, participant and/or spectator does not adhere to any of the said above and displays a non-conducive manner of sportsmanship, it will be the right of the organizing committee to have the coach, participant and/or spectator suspended and/or removed from the premises and from all WushuCanada sanctioned events.

14. REQUIRED FORMS, MEDICAL AND EQUIPMENT:

The delegation of each team / athlete must UPLOAD online the following: If participating in competition, you need:

- Provide proof of age/citizenship via passport or Birth Certificate.
- Medical form completion by licensed physician.


Participants are responsible to bring their own appropriate attire and equipment for each participating event i.e. Uniforms, weapons, apparatus, sanda equipment, etc.

IMPORTANT NOTICES:

- 1) In the case of emergency or unexpected accidents, the Competition Organizer has the right to cease the competition. There will be no refunds of fees paid.
- 2) Determination of Sanda Bouts: Upon analysis of all participants according to class and weights. Appropriate bouts shall be assigned and matched with a variance of no more than +/- 10lbs depending on assigned category within class regulations that shall maximize the safety of all participants within a competitive range.




