

Living with Crocodiles...

- Crocodiles are most active in the morning and early evening. Avoid the lagoon or river's edge during these prime feeding hours.
- Do not leave pets unattended and keep them away from the water's edge during croc peak hours.
- Fish scraps and garbage can attract crocodiles and crocodile prey. Do not clean fish or dump household scraps in the water, as crocs will be attracted to the easy meal.
- **NEVER** feed crocodiles. It is illegal and creates aggressive animals, which can become a real threat for the **WHOLE** community.
- **DO NOT HARASS** crocodiles. It is illegal and could create problematic crocs.
- Crocodiles may be more frequently seen as well as more active during mating and nesting season (roughly December to August); be aware of your surroundings!
- Crocodiles are a keystone predator, thus are an integral to the sustainability and health of their environment.
- **Be a Wildlife Champion** and educate your community about being croc wise to ensure the safety of your community and crocodile population.
