Spring “Trash and Dash” event Saturday April 26th 2025 (10AM)

It's time again for our “Adopt-A-Highway” ditch clean up event. We have signs on US Hwy 10, a two mile stretch from the overpass at Rice southeast to Pine's Edge Grocery (BP gas station). Between Mile Post Markers 163 and 165. We will gather at Dennis & Kathy's pole barn (11770 W. Lake Rd., Rice) on Saturday April 26th at 10:00AM. Some snacks and drink will be provided. We will leave at 10:15AM, We can park near the BP gas station and off the ramps in Rice. As in the past, we will start two groups at each end and meet in the middle (that would make about a 1 mile walk). I would like to have one helper vehicle to pick up walkers and get them back to their cars.

Following clean-up, we can do a car cruise, so drive your classic ride (if interested in doing so). *It's always good to have a car cruise!* We will end up somewhere to grab a bite (location to be determined). I will have safety vests and trash bags. Bring a poking stick, dry boots, and clothing appropriate for the weather.

We were short on helpers last year, so I really would like a head count first so that we can make this happen. Would like a have 16 walkers (four groups of 4), plus a vehicle runner. With only 12 walkers, it will take 1.5 to 2 hours to finish the job, with 16 we can get this done in about 1 to 1.50 hours. I will have a sign up sheet at the April general meeting and/or you can call me at (320)333-6019 if you are able to make it. In case of bad weather, we can either reschedule for later in the day, or on the following Saturday May 3rd. Hope to see you there. Thanks! Dennis

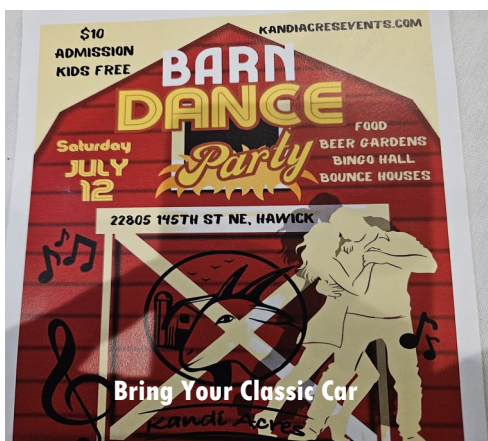
