75 hp 1500, 5sp fuel injection, 1800 lb. curb weight, removable targa roof panel car. The X1/9 was originally built by Fiat in 1972 in Turin, Italy and continued till 1982. Fiat in 1982 was going through tough times and no longer wanted to produce or import the X1/9 to the US. Nuccio Bertone (BERTONE) the designer of the body took over the production in early 1983 and continued until his death in 1989. Nuccio Bertone was also the designer for Lamborghini, Ferrari, Pininfarina, Volvo and Alfa Romeo. My car is 1 of only approximately 140 imported in 1983 to the US because of it's uncertain future with the new badging BERTONE. It is nearly all original with the exception of a modified exhaust and header. It has just under 11,000 miles on it. Thanks for voting for our car. Jason and Shannon Adamski.


about 90 students. Each group will have approximately 35 minutes to view the cars.


