Valve Cover Race Track and Cars by Dennis Arntson

Would like to thank Rock City Rods Car Club for their donation of the Valve Cover Race Track that we have used at our last two Annual Car Show and Swap Meets. Also would like to thank the Board for approving the funds available from Nick Prom's "Catch Me If You Can" event that he put together (about 10 years ago) for the sole benefit of our car club, and with Linda Prom's cash donation, together helped our club purchase an enclosed trailer for storage of our new track. Now, following the success of the Valve Cover Race Track from the last two car shows, I proposed at our November meeting that interested club members build their own valve cover racers over the winter months in preparation for competition at our May 2024 General Meeting. The plan is to have a contest for: (A) the best valve cover racer in design and, (B) the fastest racer on the track. The rules for building a valve cover racer are as follows compliments of Steve Wendt.

Valve Cover Racing Rules and Regulations THE CARS:

- 30" Maximum Overall Car Length
- 10" Total Height
- 10" Total Width
- 10 LBS Total Weight By Our Scale
- No Engines or Propulsion Of Any Kind
- No Moving Weights
- Cars Must Have 4 Wheels (Inside or Outside), Each Wheel 6" Diameter Max
- Wheels Must Have a Non-Metallic Surface Contacting The Track
- Cars Shall Be Based On An Actual Rocker Cover From A Car/Truck Engine
- Nothing Shall Extend Beyond The Gasket Surface On The Front Of The Car
- Cars Must Have A Permanent Number Affixed
- The Car Can Have A Chassis, But Cannot Be Interchanged With Any Other Body After Being Registered
- The Car Must Be Clean. If It Drips, You Lose

THE TRACK:

- The Judge's Decision Is Final
- The Track Will Consist of 2 Lanes. Each Lane is 18'
- The Driver Will Release Their Own Car On The Green Light. If You Jump The Light, You Will Lose That Round
- If A Car Interferes With Another Car, You Lose That Round
- If A Car is Hampered By A Track Issue, They Will Receive A Re-Run
- If A Car Crosses The Center Line, You Lose That Round
- If Neither Car Makes It To The Finish Line, The Car That Makes It The Farthest Is Declared The Winner

Defensive Winter Driving Tips

Ice on a roadway is not like ice in a glass of water. You don't necessarily see it. If it's a sunny day you can have glare on the road that makes the roadway look wet when there is actually ice on the road and it can catch you by surprise. If you have to drive on ice, slow down to a crawl.

When it's freezing or near freezing be extra careful on bridges, overpasses, and streets shaded by trees or buildings. These areas tend to freeze before the rest of the roadway and they're the last to thaw out. If it's icy and you approach a curve, slow down before you get to the curve. If you suddenly slow down or speed up while turning, you will go into a skid.

Like ice, snow can be deceptive too, once it starts to pack down and then you have temperature changes where it melts some, freezes, melts some, and freezes. You end up with that icy condition again. Yes, you can see it, but it can still be very deceptive in terms of how slick it can actually be. Again, it is essential to slow down. If you're driving in packed snow cut your speed to half of what you would normally drive. To increase traction use snow tires or tire chains placed over the tires.

Whether you're driving in snow or rain the American Automobile Association gives seven tips for safer driving. **One,** prepare in advance. Clean your windows and lights. Check the tread and pressure of your tires. Check your windshield wipers, lights and other equipment to make sure they are in good working order. **Two,** be extra careful. Drive slower and allow extra space between your car and others. **Three,** Drive in the tracks of the vehicle in front of you. Since those tracks are drier than the surrounding pavement they provide better traction. **Four,** give plenty of advanced notice to other drivers. If you plan to stop or slow down let other drivers know early enough so that they have time to react safely. **Five,** be alert. Watch for pedestrians trying to get out of the weather. **Six,** keep your low beam headlights on. This help you to see better and help others to see you. **Seven,** ease your way into turns or curbs avoiding any sudden starts and stops.
