

Car Show Chairman Report

Hi Everyone, Thanks to all who helped with our car show! It is a team effort and it takes many to make the show happen! I think our show did well considering road construction, the price of gas, competing with The Nationals at Brainard and the fact of Gear Heads being just the day before, and some will not go to a show 2 days in a row. I did a walk through the show and a quick inventory of the attendance, so with what Wendy & Lisa reported and what I counted we had a decent turnout for our show: 414 through the main gate, plus 42 in the Laid-Back class, plus 28 in the ice arena plus 14 motorcycles, also 41 club cars, 4 club motorcycles, the 2



youth winners, the school race car, and the $4\frac{1}{2}$ Pan cars. That gives us $550\frac{1}{2}$ cars, trucks & amp; motorcycles in the show, 3 peddle cars and bikes, 52 models in the contest and 2 submarine models plenty to see! In addition, we had over 300 swappers and over 60 cars in the corral for those looking to make purchases. We tried a couple new things this year, one of which was the Laid-Back Class and it turned out to be our largest with 42 entries. This type of thing, a show with out awards, is a growing trend in the hobby currently and this is something I think we can continue to grow with some tweaks and improvements. Thanks to the Next X club for helping with the class and I feel we should continue developing our relationship between our clubs. The second biggest class was our 1994 to present modern muscle with almost 30 entries. Our 2 lowest classes were the Classic 25-48 with only 2 entries and Collector 46-54 with only 3 entries so we can see where the trend is going - the new cars are the future of our hobby. One of the other new things was live music by Robbie Vee, and I had many good comments about Robbie's show and Robbie said he enjoyed our show and would come back If we want - something to think about in the future. Another addition was playing the National Anthem at 8 AM but only a limited group got to hear it, so something to think about how we can improve that and in general the DJ music throughout the show. We made over \$57,000 on the show, about \$2500 more than last year, and due to donations, we received this year to cover some of the expenses, the club is sitting in a good place financially. Speaking of donations, please remember to thank, the following when you see them: Andy Mohs at Miller Buick and GMC for sponsoring our awards and providing radio and internet show promotions, Angela at MCSI for contributing all of our flyers and Don & Lois Blonigen for donating all of our gate passes, meal and pop tickets! I will have show dash plagues at the meeting for any who still wants one. With the huge milestone of our 50th car show coming up in 2 years in 2025, I have formed a committee to plan some special things for that event. So far Randy Marchand, Jim Stodolka and myself are on the committee, and we are welcoming more of you to join us or contribute ideas to help make our 50th show a special event! Thanks again to all for the help and support you have given me - I really appreciate it! As I have said in the past, we have a great car club with great people and I'm proud to be part of it!


