





Hello Everyone, THANK YOU, THANK YOU, THANK YOU!!

The 2022 Car Show & Swap Meet is now in the history books. Thanks to all club member, their friends and family, and other organizations that helped to work and make this car show successful. I think the numbers (\$) will show that we did great. Coming off an event like this gets a person excited to plan for next year, and I know Bob Halliday will do a great job getting this in motion for a successful 2023 show.....so volunteer early.....right Bob? There are a lot of good things to say about the car show, that I witnessed as I went around. As in past years, all car show chairs (from show cars, car corral, swap, kitchen, clean up, the list goes on...) knew what had to be done, and did their jobs well. I believe we even had everything cleaned up and had the fairgrounds back to "better than pre-car show condition" in record time. I heard from several spectators about how well organized and how big our show was, and that we have a lot to offer. I heard from swappers that like coming to our show. These types of comments are a testament to the value we offer to the community. I will have an After Action Meeting with all car show chairpersons in either late September or early October to discuss what worked well and what needs improvement to make an even better show for next year. If there are other club members that want to attend this meeting, watch for detail. One thing to look at will be the Valve Cover Races. I believe it was a success with about 20 racers, and would like to thank all involved with this including, but not limited to: Steve Wendt for organizing/running it, Rick Johnson from Rock City Rods for bringing it to our show, and Terry Yager and Hot Rod Hoodlums for building it. With all things considered, it would be difficult to put on a car show like we do without our sponsors. I truly want to thank them all, and in particular I want to thank Miller Buick GMC and Gilleland Chevrolet for what they did to sponsor all of our trophies and provide great advertising for our show on the airwaves at no cost to us. To show appreciation for their support, I am trying to work with Andy Mohs at Miller to do a car show in their parking lot. Hopefully this can happen yet this fall, or if not, maybe early next year. I know people are going to ask, so I will give you estimated numbers for this year, actual numbers to be verified later: All show cars (outdoor/indoor, including club cars) to be about 540, swap spots around 310, car corral at 78 and motorcycles at 23. These numbers are down some from last year, but above others. ++ Most all of the new staff workers shirts were given out to members for the show. If you have old ones that are in good condition and/or may not fit anymore, please return them to the club clean so that others may use them. ++ This year's Fun Run was a great success as well. Jim Zwilling said they had 178 cars attend. About the same number as last year. Think about this....if each car being about 15 to 18 feet long, and if tightly parked at about 20 feet per car, 178 cars would make a line 3,560 feet or 2/3 mile long. When cruising, this line becomes miles long!! ++ Also want to thank the Benton County Fair Board for allowing us to display cars in the Ice Arena during the county fair. We were not charged to do this and it helped to promote our car show to all fair goers. I am sure it was successful, because I think we had a large number of spectators come to our show this year. ++ Still have 50th Anniversary Window Stickers for sale at \$1 each. ++ Remember...If you have a project you are working on, recently finished, or intend to do, please write an article along with photos to Jim Zwilling. 
