1959 Goggomobile T-400 Sunroof Deluxe
Owner Tim Carlson

It was spring of 1967 and I was standing , with a couple of buddies, at a window of the library on the second floor of Washington High School (Sioux Falls SD) over looking the faculty parking lot. Looking down, we all laughed at the "little red car" in the corner of the lot. It was a perfect spot for that car because no other car would fit there. The car was owned by one of the teachers, Mr. Robert Parlett. In June of that same year I was with a buddy going west on 41st street and there was that little car in the lot of Soo Import, the VW dealer. I told my buddy to turn around so we could check it out. Yup, sure enough Mr. Parlett had traded it in for a bigger car....a Volkswagen. A couple days later I burrowed enough from my Dad and became the proud owner of my first car, a 1959 Goggomobile T-400 Sunroof Deluxe....yes ... that "little red car". The Goggo is powered by a 2 cycle—2 cyl—400 CC motor. Power is going to the rear wheels through a 4 speed Electromagnetic Perselective Gearing transmission. That was June 20, 1967. I still have the bill of sale. Little did I know then that I would still own it 54 years later and the changes it would go through. If my Goggo could talk it could probably tell a few stories....I guess I'm lucky it can't....I might have to plead the 5th. That was many years ago and since then the Goggo has seen very few driven miles and a few different garages, storage shed and warehouses for safe storage. That was until just a few years back when my son Jason and I decided to either get it running and drive it as is or get to work on a full restoration. I didn't take long to decide to go for the restoration. And now thanks to Jason, Barry Dohrmann (Dohrmann's Custom Automotives), John Trutwin (JT Upholstery), Dan, Rick and Mike (Midwest Motor Sports) and UWE Staufenberg (my German parts supplier) my Goggo is back on the road better than new. However, now it is no longer the "little red car"....it is now the "little BLUE car". Thanks for voting for my Goggo for the 2022 calendar. Tim Carlson.

WHAT IS A COLLECTOR CAR? The question was brought forth inquiring how old should a vehicle be in order to be considered a collector and included in the listings of our club roster? It was noted that we have some later model vehicles listed and should they really be included, since our club's name indicates antique autos? First let me say that there are very few true antique autos in our club, so we need to look past that word, but how new should the vehicles be? This was a subject of discussion at our April Board Meeting, and the Board agreed we should be following the guidelines for the state of Minnesota for qualifications of a collector vehicle. Minnesota statute 168.1 states a collector vehicle is at least 20 years old and goes further with three sub divisions a vehicle may be considered as if older than 1949: Pioneer, Classic and Street Rod. Also, the statute does have one exception for vehicles less than 20 years old and that is if they had a production number of 500 or less, they can be considered collector vehicles. These guidelines will be our club policy going forward, as established by our club Board of Directors. I feel the Board's decision is in line with the original intent of the club when it was formed and we will be reflecting our club's established principles. If you notice that any of your vehicles have been omitted from the roster, please be sure to add them back in when they are 20 years old. If you have proof that yours qualifies as a limited production vehicle, please bring it to the Board for review and approval. Thanks for your understanding and cooperation with establishing these guidelines for our club. **Bob Halliday your Club President**


Car Show Chairman Report
