

2020 - 3T's BATS BASEBALL – AGES 9u-13u



3T's BATS FEES = \$498

- \$199 non-refundable deposit is required when the contract is submitted.
 - ***This fee and contract must be submitted within 3 days of contract offer***
- \$299 due by November 1st
 - Payment Plan Option
 - 2 Monthly payments of \$149.50 – due on Oct 1st & Nov 1st

INCLUDES:

- **Instructional Practices**
 - Practices are from the beginning of January – End of Tournament Season
 - 1 indoor practice a week from January 1 – Spring Break
 - 2 outdoor practices - After Spring Break – End of Season
- **Facility Membership**
 - Full use of the facility from October 26, 2019 – May 14, 2020
 - Batting cage & Pitching mound usage
 - Scheduled Team Hitting Times
 - Discounts on lessons & clinics

ADDITIONAL COST:

- **Tournament & Supply Cost**
 - Between \$50 - \$65 per tournament (*\$15 per game*)
 - Tournament fees due in full by February 1st
 - Tournament Fee will vary based on travel. Expect \$50 for a local tournament and \$65 or more for a travel event.
 - 9u – 13u Teams
 - 8 – 10 Tournaments
 - When your team is playing out of town, each parent is responsible for all meals and lodging or makes other arrangements if they are unable to accompany their child. It is not the coaches' responsibility.
- **Uniform Cost**
 - Approximately \$150 - \$175 will be paid per player
 - Uniform fees will be due November 1st, 2019

AGES 9U – 13U

- Baseball Players age on May 1st, 2020 determines age division of play
- Teams will have a maximum of 11 players

DIVISION OF PLAY

- **Gold Teams:** Major, this is the highest competitive level of local and regional competition.
- **Purple Teams:** AAA, this is very competitive level of local and regional competition.
- **Black Teams:** AA, this is a competitive level of local and state competition.
- **Gray Teams:** A, this is a competitive level of local and state competition.

FUNDRAISING:

- We offer a fundraiser for each individual family to help off-set fees.

POLICIES

COACHES

Our goal is to develop fundamentals, teamwork and leadership. Coaches will have the safety and general well-being of the players in mind. Our coaches will not intimidate players, embarrass or ridicule them. Our coaches will treat the players with respect. All coaches will be held to the highest standard of child development and are ultimately responsible for the answering to the Director.

- *All Head Coaches and Assistant Coaches are required to attend baseball clinics and practices prior to the beginning of spring practices, enhancing their teaching of the sport to help improve the skills of their players and to learn from the staff at 3T's All Star Sports Academy.*
- *Tournament and league games are conducted by the game coach. The game coach is chosen by 3T's and the Coach is put through a Certification process.*

PLAYERS - Rules & Expectations

- Players are not allowed to argue with coaches, parents or umpires for any reason.
- Foul language and profanity are not tolerated at any time.
- Good Sportsmanship is a quality that is exemplified by our players. Taunting of your own, as well as opposing players, fans or umpires, will not occur.
- Self-indulgence by players, such as hanging one's head after an error or mental mistake, pouting over personal failure, will have no place on the team.

PLAYER – Tournament Commitment

- Players are not only responsible to the Bats Organization but also to the 10 of families on their team.
- Due to our small rosters of only 11 players, all Bats players are expected to participate in each tournament game.
- Bat players are NOT encouraged to play on another team during their tournament season. If this occurs then Bats tournament games are the priority.
 - If a tournament game is going to be missed, Bats Coach & Director must be notified 30 days prior.

PLAYER - Penalty for Violation of Tournament Commitment:

- \$50 fee for each game missed

PARENTAL PARTICIPATION—Expectations & Rules The success of the Bats depends on the commitment of everyone in our organization. Parents are encouraged to attend practices and games. You may be called upon to help with practice drills, score keeping and other items. Game coaching responsibilities are assigned by the director.

Rules for Parents:

- We want the Bats to be known as a “Class Organization.” We ask the parents, relatives, and friends attending the games absolutely to not abuse umpires, opposing coaches or players as well as our own players in any way.
- During games, parents are respectfully asked to remain a good distance away from the dugout unless asked by the coaches. Players are instructed not to talk to their parents and friends while a game is in progress. Please allow the only adult contact with your son during a game to be with the coaching staff.
- Any parent challenging the authority of a Bats coach will be asked to leave the team. Verbal or physical abuse of coaches will not be tolerated.
- 3T's Bats Baseball reserves the right to “suspend” parents from attending games at the discretion of the Director.
- Parents that may have concerns or questions are required to follow proper procedure.
 - Never address the coach before, during or immediately following a game or practice. **Must wait 30 minutes.**
 - Always follow the proper chain of command — Coach — Director
 - Email is not for conflict resolution. It is simply for fact gathering.

ENFORCEMENT OF RULES AND VIOLATIONS The rules and expectations listed are in place to ensure the quality development of our teams while maintaining the integrity of our organization. Any violations of these rules by parents or players can lead to any of the following consequences:

- Formal warning will be issued and documented
- Suspension from participation in at least one game but for no more than two weeks will be issued and documented
- Possible expulsion from the Bats Baseball Organization

PLAYING TIME will be recorded by each coach. A running record of innings that a Bats player is on the bench will be kept and regulated. The Coach, with the direction of the Director, will determine the best playing positions for each child. It is the goal of the Bats organization to put players in positions in which we feel each child will have the most success. Playing all positions is not a goal of the program; however, the Bats coaching staff feels that players should experience multiple positions numerous times throughout the season.
