Andrew (Andy) Peebles Nimmo

9 December 1938 — 14 May 2015

On May 14, 2015, with the death of Andy Nimmo, Canada lost a prominent student of the Trichoptera. In addition Andy was a long-time substitute science teacher, bibliographer, forester, naturalist and outdoorsman (he fashioned camp fires that would have been visible from the moon with the unaided eye), philatelist (he served on the executive committee of the Edmonton Stamp Club for many years), voracious reader, world traveler, railway buff (he, twice [1989, 2012] crossed Russia from Vladivostok to Moscow on the Trans Siberian Railway and worked the summer of 1974 as a machinist's helper in Canadian National's diesel shops in the Calder yards, Edmonton), pipe-smoker (using tobacco he grew himself), and dour but proud Scot. Born in Wick, Caithness, in the extreme northeast of Scotland (his father, David McKay Nimmo, served as chaplain to a glider unit flying into Normandy during the D-day landings), Andy was educated in schools in Torrence and Kirkcaldy, before moving with his family to Port Hood on the west coast of Cape Breton, Nova Scotia, where he completed his pre-college education. He earned a B. Sc. (Forestry) from the University of New Brunswick in 1961, an M. Sc. in 1964, and Ph. D. in 1970, both in the Entomology Department of the University of Alberta, and in 1983, an Alberta Teaching Certificate from the same institution.

During his life, Andy authored or co-authored some 81 items (see list), most importantly, in 1996, Volume 1 (1961-1970, viii + 597pp.) of *Bibliographia Trichopterorum*. A world bibliography of Trichoptera (Insecta) with indices, Pensoft (Vol. 2, 1971—1980 was almost complete at the time of his death and other decadal volumes at various stages of preparation). Beginning in 1981, he published 27 additional bibliographies on Trichoptera and other benthic invertebrates mostly for *The North American Benthological Society* and the *Society for Freshwater Science*. Fifteen of his papers appeared in refereed journals, the most substantial of which are detailed, well written and illustrated faunal studies of adults of species in the families Rhyacophilidae, Limnephilidae, Glossosomatidae, Philopotamidae, Polycentropodidae, Arctopsychoidea, Apataniidae, Hydropsychoidea, and Uenoidea, collectively adding vastly to our knowledge of their distribution in Canada and adjacent areas and the Russian Far East. He described 2 new genera and 45 new species of Trichoptera, published 7 book reviews, 9 short articles in successive *Proceedings of the International Symposia on Trichoptera* (he participated in 12 of these from 1977 [Reading, England] to 2012 [Vladivostok, Russia]), and 19 other articles, including lists of the caddisflies of Waterton Lakes and Kluane National Parks, British Columbia, the Yukon, the Northwest Territories and Alaska, and a singular account (1976) of the insects meeting their ends on the noses of fast moving diesel locomotives.

That Andy published as much as he did and was able to travel so widely is remarkable since, except for three and a half years as assistant curator (invertebrates) in the Hancock Museum, Newcastle-on-Tyne, he was unsuccessful in securing permanent employment and had to support himself with countless summer jobs and short term contracts mostly with Parks Canada, the Alberta government, and faculty members of the University of Alberta, and by many years of substitute

teaching (mostly Chemistry) in evening and summer classes in Edmonton Continuing Education and in schools throughout the city.

He is survived by his wife of 12 years, Carita Nybom, daughters Alice (Douglas James) and Emma Nimmo, grandchildren Gillian and Thomas Nimmo-James and is warmly remembered by his many friends and colleagues in the World Trichoptera community and in Edmonton and the University of Alberta.
