



The appearance or odor of plastic can fool sea animals into thinking that plastic is edible. Harmful chemicals in the plastic can also be released into the seawater affecting the entire



Sea lions, dolphins, whales, and sea birds are all examples of ocean animals that can become entangled in plastic items such as six-pack rings, plastic bags, or abandoned fishnets. This affects their ability to feed and swim.




Percentage of marine debris that is plastic.
