WIP will also recognize the work of our Entrepreneurship and Micro-Lending Advisory Circle and be joined by the current participants and recent graduates of the University of Scranton's Small Business Development Center's StartUP program.



History Committee News

The History Committee has applied for two grants to assist with archiving the rich history of the Junior League of Scranton. One grant could provide funding for digitization of all League scrapbooks from the 1930s through 1960s totaling more than 900 pages, as well as other archiving supplies. The other grant would provide funding for both the History Committee and Membership Development Committee. It would provide funding for archiving supplies, a bus tour for the Provisional Class that would showcase League and local history, and an opening reception for a League historical exhibit open to the public. In June, the committee purchased archival boxes to store the League's copies of the *Dope Sheet*, *Focus*, and *The Source*, as well as anti-static cotton gloves that will protect scrapbooks, documents, photos, and artifacts from oils while being handled.
