

Ruidoso Update!

As many of you may remember, just over 3 months ago. The Southwest Model A's, along with the Model A Ford Club of America, were forced to cancel the 2024 National Convention due to the natural disasters that devastated the Ruidese community.

At the time of cancellation, our first priority was to ensure the safety of our attendees and the families in the area. Once we got everyone safety notified, we began the process of identifying how to go about "unwinding" the first national convention MAFCA has ever been forced to cancel.

Both organizations committed to refunding tees paid by altendess to the Southwest Model A's for the National Convention if requested. We knew this could be a substantial financial burden, estimated at the time to be over \$85,000.00 more than the current, available cash balance. Even though this was a huge dollar amount, MAFCA stood ready, willing and able to back up The Southwest Model A's to completely meet all their financial obligations, as we do with any chapter that hosts a national event.



They disconnected the headlight harness and removed the taillight bulb and that caused the fuse to stop blowing (they'll figure out why later), and voila, the engine started!

Excited, Josh couldn't wait to take the old Ford for a ride, even though he had never driven a Model A before! And he drove it without a hitch!

After going up the block and back, Josh's wife Megan jumped in and joined him, and off he went again, as their daughter, Mckenzie, looked on.
