OGDEN FIRE TOUR BY RON LUCERO

Another interesting tour was done for the Model A club touring season. We had 20 people that attended the tour, 6 Model A's and two other classic vehicles. This tour was of the Ogden City Fire Department which is an organization of men and women who serve our local community in fire safety and emergency medical. The fire department responds with ambulances, rescue squad and fire apparatus for service to the Ogden community, and along with service to South Ogden and Riverdale.



We were met by shift Captain Dustin Mayhou, who is one of the fire officers on duty, and two crew firefighters Jackson Hokanson and Jared Bardo. These are just three of the many personnel on duty at the station. We were shown the station bay area and had the opportunity to see up close one of the fire engines

in the truck bay. Firefighters Jackson and Jared showed the various types of safety equipment used by the fire fighters when fighting a fire.



After a question-and-answer period covering the equipment and the vehicle bay area, we were shown where the men and women "hang out" until needed.

The alarms that notify the firefighters of an emergency call are done by a tone and lighting system. RED, GREEN, that signify that an emergency call is needed. As on our previous tour, the 911 emergency call center is the one initiating the emergency call, giving location and type of emergency call. So, the men and women respond to the call by jumping into the required vehicle, an ambulance, a fire engine, or paramedic rescue squad to respond to the call needed. With lights and sirens, they respond to the emergency call.

The ambulances and rescue squads are supplied with all the needed items to help stabilize and save a life. The fire engines are modern up to date fire apparatus, able to pump water and help suppress any fire.

They demonstrated their power tools for extrication from vehicles and they also demonstrated self-contained breathing apparatus. One of the highlights was right at the end the ambulance, rescue squad, and engine responded to a high priority medical call so they bid us farewell with lights and sirens blazing and blaring.

Our Ogden city fire department is an outstanding organization with outstanding personnel to help service the public in the areas of accidents, health issues and transport to the local hospitals. The fire apparatus will help suppress any type of fire situation and the brave men and women of the Ogden City Fire Department deserve our thanks.

They limped it home again and listened to the engine. The knock was coming from the bottom end.

Ron drained the oil and didn't find anything suspicious, so he removed the oil pan and found the babbitt was failing and one of the cylinders was very dark. So, we're down a Model A for a short time while Ron gets the engine rebuilt. But it'll be back soon!

The 15 Minute Job


Everyone has one of these. If you haven't you will. It's a simple 15-minute job that turns nasty fast. Ours started out with a simple welding job to help out Dennis Thompson with his truck. He needed a couple of small patches on his fenders. We have some nice welding equipment in my shop. An inexpensive MIG welder with gas shielding, a TIG welder as well as a gas setup. For deconstruction we have a pretty good-sized plasma cutter. And I can sort of weld. As Dennis puts it, "The bigger the glob the better the job." I REALLY need more time on the welders, especially the TIG.

For body work the TIG has more heat control and leaves a softer weld so it's easier to clean up later. The best TIG operator I know is married to my sister. He's really good at it. So, we prevailed on him to come do the welding in an effort to not have a heat wrinkled mess on our hands.

Shawn brought him over to my shop, Dennis showed up with the fenders and a hopeful expression on his face. Mick, my brother-in-law, looked over the gear and the job and started cleaning up the work area. He made some practice runs on some scrap to get the feel of the welder and started on fenders.



Well, that's when a set of reasonably nice fenders took a turn for the worse. As Mick welded metal poured out from under the paint. Heating the metal to weld had resulted in us finding a pocket of lead that had been previously used to repair the body. We just couldn't get it cleaned up to weld on it. In the cleaning process we found some bondo under the paint. After about two hours we figured we'd done enough damage and it was as good as it could get without a complete paint strip and sand blast. Dennis graciously thanked us for messing up his fenders and started hunting for a new set.



The fifteen-minute job took a lot longer than expected and the result was not what we had imagined.

As our cars near 100 years old, a lot has been done to them to keep them on the road. No matter what you start, you never know what you'll find.
