

On the 16th of June 1903, at 9:30 in the morning, Henry Ford and prospective stockholders met in Detroit, Michigan to sign the official paperwork to create the new FORD corporation. Twelve stockholders signed and witnessed the notarizing of the forms and then the forms were sent to the office of Michigan's Secretary of State, and the Ford corporation was officially started.





Swedish Model A Ambulance



At first glance, the car shown above looks like a Model A Ford—front fenders, grille, hood, and cowl. Yet, it looks different. The side windows look much wider than on a typical Model A sedan, and the rear doors open “suicide” style. So what exactly is this car?

Well, it is a 1931 Model A Ford, but it is a Swedish Model A, not an American Model A. And it has a special-built body built for ambulance service. As the photo below shows, the body has no “B” pillar which allows the doors to open wide, and the seats fold down into a bed, allowing easy ingress and egress of an injured or sick person. Quite a clever design.

A Special Club Member

Our own George Prawitt, a retired Army Lt. Colonel, was nominated and selected to be a part of the Honor Flight to Washington D.C. at the end of May. This fine organization was created with a simple, yet powerful, mission: to honor our nation's veterans by bringing them to our nation's capital to visit the memorials built to commemorate their service and sacrifice. Honor Flight transports over 22,000 veterans annually, and it has flown over 300,000 veterans to Washington, D.C. since its inception in 2005.

And George certainly deserves this honor. He was a pilot in Vietnam flying reconnaissance missions to spot enemy troops for the Army. And if you think that was from a U-2 spy jet at 70,000 feet, think again..., it was from a teeny tiny, single-engine airplane like the one shown below, called the L19 Bird Dog! And he did that over two tours of duty: one from 1962-1963 and again from 1969-1970.


George also flew a De Havilland plane in Germany. Between tours, he was an electrical engineer for the Army. And if you want to see a movie that features daring adventures in a Bird Dog plane, check out *BAT-21*, starring Gene Hackman and Danny Glover.

The Golden Spike Tour



Half a world behind each back...*


The poem goes on, because it's quite long, but this is enough to illustrate the event.




