Purpose of Utility Rates (From Environmental Finance Center Network - EFCN):

IHWD receives Property taxes which are designated to reserves for Capital Improvement Projects. Water Rate revenue designated to cover Operating Expenses: Admin, Ops, & Employee

Foundation of Rates (EFCN):
