

CONSERVATION GUIDELINES

Indian Hills Water District (IHWD) maintains the priorities of the district as providing clean, safe, drinking water and supporting a reserve of water for fire suppression.

While other activities within the district that require the use of water may not be in these priorities, IHWD recognizes that these activities help to contribute to a high quality of life that we all enjoy. These activities include, but are not limited to: maintaining livestock for pleasure (horses, "hobby" animals) and gardening.

IHWD would like to continue to encourage a *Culture of Conservation* of our water resources. During times of drought, this becomes especially important. Therefore, IHWD is offering these guidelines, in conjunction with increased rates, during the different phases of drought or in leak or maintenance situations, to help the residents of our district protect and conserve our resources.

Phase I

Voluntary Water Conservation

Limit outside use

Monitor inside use

Phase II

Outside use limited to hand watering only (no sprinklers, no watering of lawns, no irrigation systems) and should be performed between 6:00 PM and 10:00 AM

No filling of pools and/or hot tubs

Reminder that the Accidental Leak Rate is suspended

Phase II Drought/Conservation Surcharge Rates in effect **

Phase III

No outside use

Water for all outside use, including livestock and large outdoor domesticated animals, should be purchased from outside the district

Limit Inside Use

Recommended usage of 35 gallons per person per day
