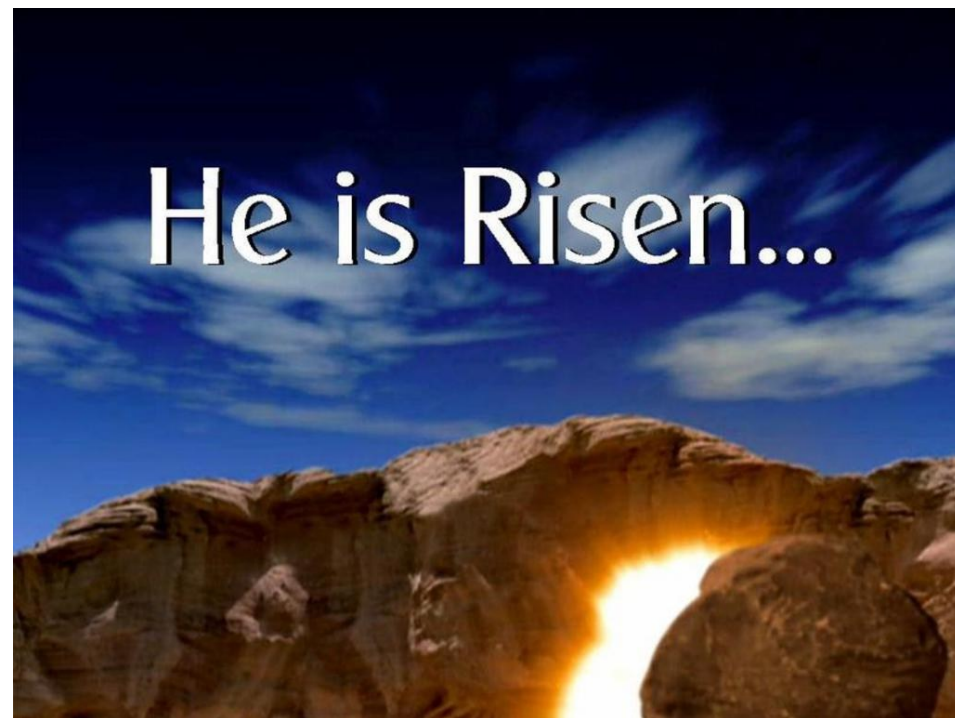

Tammy's Touch

There's a part of the Easter story we often overlook-**Saturday**. *The day after the cross, but before the resurrection. The day when everything felt silent & it seemed like hope was gone. But just because it felt hopeless didn't mean hope was gone. God was still working. While the disciples were weeping, while the world thought death had won, God was preparing for resurrection. And on the third day, Jesus rose.*

So, if you're in a season of waiting, where God feels silent, if you're praying & don't see an answer, don't give up. What feels like a silent Saturday may just be the day before resurrection. God is still working, even when you can't see it. Hope is still alive, even when it feels far away.
