

Stand Firm

Put on the full armor of God, so that you will be able to **stand firm** against the schemes of the devil... so that you will be able to resist in the evil day, and having done everything, to **stand firm**. **Stand firm**, therefore... (Ephesians 6:11, 13-14)

A humorous saying which I used to quote says, "Don't just do something, stand there!" And that is exactly what Paul calls Christian soldiers to do here. And he wants to emphasize it so much, he doesn't say it just once, not twice, not even three times, but four times in these few verses. He wanted to get it pounded into our minds that the best thing we can do in Spiritual Warfare is simply to stand our ground....

Why would we get such orders? What kind of plan of attack is this? Who has ever won a war by just standing their ground?

Well, first of all, we're not trying to win a war. The war has already been won. Jesus won the entire war for us when He died on the cross and rose from the dead. We don't have to march out to meet the enemy, because the enemy is already defeated. The enemy has already been vanquished. The enemy has already been conquered. Thankfully, God didn't tell us to go out

Therefore put on the full armor of God ...

there and defeat Satan, because we never could have done that. That would be a suicide mission. He is much stronger and powerful than any one of us. God knows that we would be easily defeated... So, we're not trying to win this war; we're just trying to survive the battle, and hold on to the ground God has given to us to defend.
