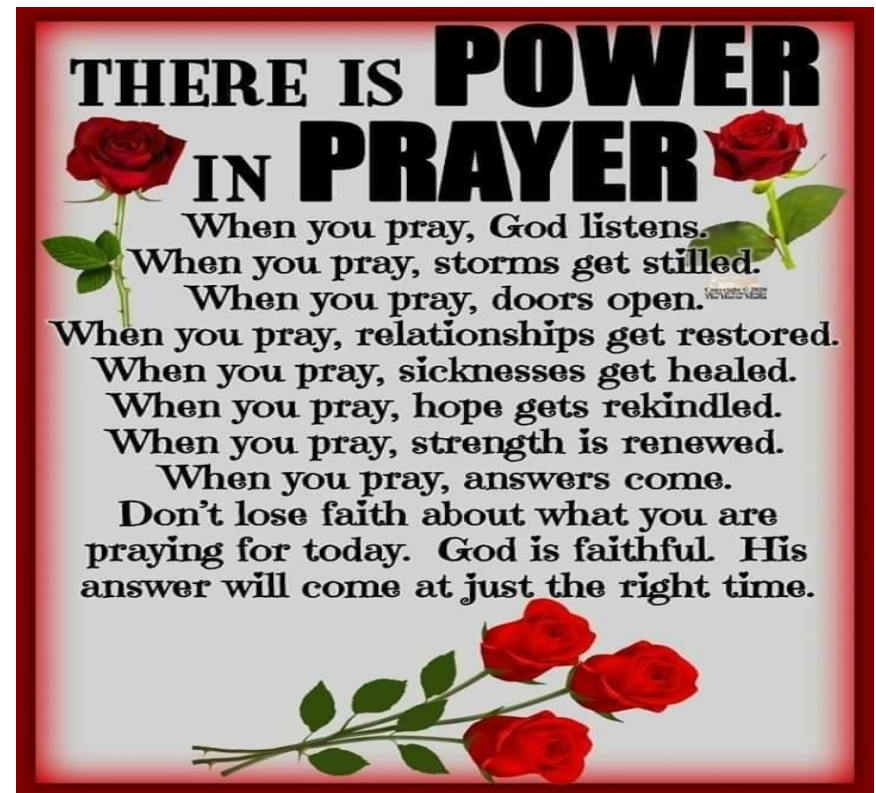
Sunday Morning Bible Study

Tammy's Touch

Once when the Israelites had fallen into idol worship, they were pursued and defeated by their enemy the Philistines, who captured the Ark of the Lord. They were devastated, mourned and repented. The next time the Philistines came against His people, God delivered them in victory over the enemy. Samuel the priest of Israel set up a stone, named it Ebenezer, saying, "Thus far the Lord has helped us."

It was a visual reminder to help the people remember God's faithfulness.

"Thus far the Lord has helped us."

Like so many others, our family is in the midst of a traumatic life event with the loss of our 40 year old son-in-law who left behind 3 very young children. I have found that in the midst of the sadness and sorrow, it helps me to look back and remember the Lord's faithfulness; how He has led our family in the past and helped us "thus far". When I look back and remember, I can go forward with less anxiety and fear over what the future holds.

To "remember" in Hebrew is not just a mental thing. Remembering is active. When you "remember", you move to action. An example is Gen. 8 when God "remembered" Noah and sent a wind to pass over the flooded earth, drying up the land. God had not "forgotten" Noah, all of a sudden thinking of him in the ark. No, God "remembered" and God moved.

OT scholar Ralph Davis writes this: "With his Ebenezer monument, Samuel seeks to rivet Israel's memory to the past and most current of Yahweh's mercies. He knows that it is memory that keeps gratitude fresh and that gratitude keeps faith faithful...We stand in the present but dwell on the past in order that we can be steadfast for the future."
